Final Peer to Peer Takeaways: HUD Intermediary Oversight and Monitoring of their Network

- Shared best practices and other recommendations for the following topics:
 - <u>Performance Reviews</u>: provide checklists to aid in the review process, conduct a self review before HUD review, include the agency's finance department in the review process
 - Monitoring and Billing Methodology: go to HUD POC with questions, ensure mutual understanding of compliance
 - Conflict of Interest (COI) and Vetting Staff: monitor news alerts and google for COI/fraud concerns, everyone should be filling out COI forms, ask subs about their internal processes
 - <u>Monitoring Certification</u>: *conduct webinars, online study groups, send out monthly reminders*
 - <u>Tools/ Resources Needed</u>: grant tracking tool, work plan template, more information on risk assessments

Final Peer to Peer Takeaways: The Housing Counselor Certification Linkages with other HUD Partners

- Shared best practices and other recommendations for the following topics:
 - Develop joint messages across HUD programs
 - Decision flow chart
 - Understanding next steps when there isn't an example to follow
 - Outreach to field offices, give tools that paint a picture of housing counseling, build relationships with PHA's
 - Partner identification tool would be helpful
 - Sample contract
 - Examples of partnerships that exist and the ties that bring the programs together
 - Understanding the cross-section of programs to benefit all parties involved
 - HOME, CDBG, and Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG)
 - Certified counselors provide families with a skilled professional that can help address housing needs and goals
 - Counseling agencies are skilled at limited English proficiency (LEP), working with the underserved, etc.

Final Peer to Peer Takeaways: HUD Intermediary Best Practices in Overseeing and Certifying Their Network

- Shared best practices and other recommendations for the following topics:
 - Schedule exam and then complete training
 - Make certification a requirement earlier than HUD deadline
 - Use HUD tools, such as the Knowledge Assessment tool and practice exam
 - Study tips: virtual study groups, schedule exam before a training, study groups that focus on sections of the exam
 - Incentives: gift cards, reimbursement of exam cost, time to study on the job
 - Resources/ tools: webinars, shared online flashcards

Final Peer to Peer Takeaways: HUD Form 9902 Data Visualization

- Shared best practices and other recommendations for the following topics:
 - Data sections to be displayed:
 - The more information that the visualizations can show, the more helpful it will be to agencies
 - State report by reporting period for Section 8 and 9
 - Visualizing data allows individuals the opportunity to:
 - See the impact of the data, which can be leveraged in grant writing and used to understand outcomes (projections vs. actuals)
 - Use the visual of the overall impact of housing counseling efforts for goal setting and understanding areas with shortcomings to justify funding and priorities for the next Fiscal Year
 - Better tell the story of Housing Counseling
