We will be flexible and work with you as we navigate these complicated times.

Also what will that look like when put into HDX? How will that work?

You will simply enter your data in HDX. We will know you at that point if you did more than what you were approved to do. We don't want you to do more work on this than is needed so no extra emails if you do more.

For instance, if you want to post a survey on a public website for anyone to complete. But you can record data collected through your coordinated entry phone calls. Also, if your street outreach or provider staff want to reach out to people they know have recently been homeless to verify where they were on the count night you can do that. If you are doing any of these kind of follows up though you can only do it if you are doing a survey in your larger effort. This will not work if you try to pair it with observation counts (because you can't tell if they have already been counted).

For instance, you say you will collect all demographics then you don't have to list each element. If you are not sure what you are doing I would recommend requesting an exception to only do a count of total people experiencing unsheltered homelessness (i.e., head count). Then, if you collect more, great. If you don't collect more you are covered. You can submit more data in HDX at the time of submission if you collected more and want to report it.

December 15, 2020 4:00 PM from William Snow to everyone: @ Thomas - there is no simple answer to this. It depends on the nature of your geography. If the location you are counting is relatively remote and it is highly unlikely that there is movement among the homeless population and

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other people who are not homeless are not likely to be in those places then you can probably count a little later. However, if you are in a city where there are people going to work at those hours then we don't encourage you to do the count in those hours.
