But also a reminder that the CDC eviction moratorium (and many local ones) only cover people being evicted for failure to pay rent. There are many other reasons that people are evicted or kicked out of housing where they may not have a lease in place. You could target your HP funds to those other populations.

We are being tasked with a significant amount of coordination related to COVID, in addition to existing tasks, and there has been no financial assistance.

Unfortunately, without the ability to fall back on eviction, the landlords simply aren't very interested. That said, we've had the most luck with one-on-one conversations with larger property managers.

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permanent housing per the ESG rule, such as habitability requirements and the program participant is able to have a lease. If hotel/motel is being used for isolation or quarantine that is an emergency shelter cost.

Funds may be used to pay for landlord incentives for up to three times the rent charged for the unit, including signing bonuses, security deposits, repairing damages incurred by the program participant not covered by the security deposit or that are incurred while the program participant is still residing in the unit, and cost of extra cleaning or maintenance.

The landlords may feel that these types of clients are at a higher risk of needing to be evicted later down the road, and providing a signing bonus will entice the landlords enough to give these clients a chance. It will also help that the landlord will have a certain number of months of guaranteed rent the agency is providing.

And a few other requirements which you can find in 2 CFR part 200.
