
#### **National COVID-19 cases**













## 53% of US population ≥ 12 is fully vaccinated

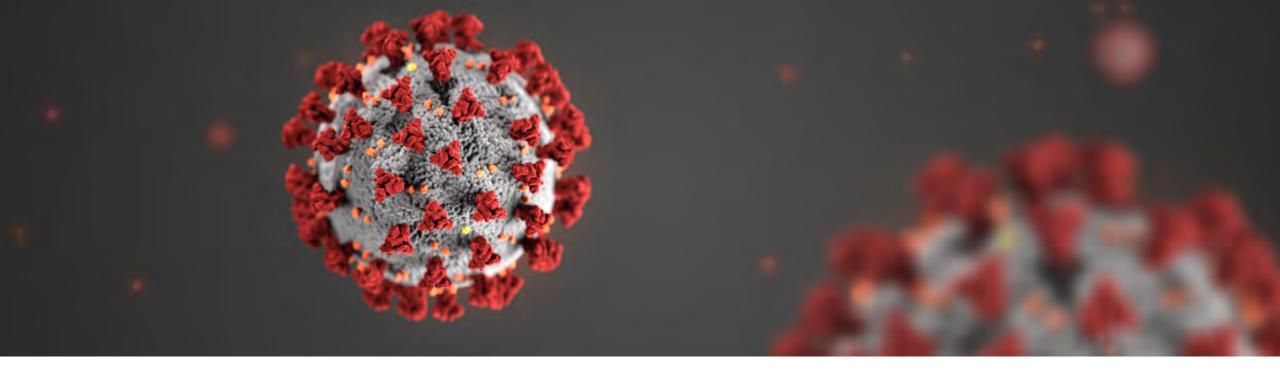





# Conflict in Interpretation

#### A Tale of Two ESGs:

- *IHCDA*: Provide Households with 9-12 months of past/future assistance
- City of Evansville: Provide only Past-Due assistance
- Community not aware of the different funding streams
  - Aurora: Provide up to 6 months arrears and 1 month ahead, unless otherwise warranted

# Conflict in Interpretation

#### ESG is restrictive:

- Aurora was identified as being awarded "large sums" of money to help with rent, but only a specific population was eligible under the criteria.
- Utility assistance was advertised as a claimable expense, but proved nearly impossible to execute due to wording in most leases
- Category 2 Homeless (At Risk) 21 days from eviction
  - Tenants requesting evictions to qualify for services

### Barriers

- People "New" to needing help
- People "Experienced" in needing help
  - Fixed/Low-income households unable to access usual financial assistance
- Navigating changing systems
  - Agency change in operations
  - Firehose of COVID Funding with delayed parameters
  - Conversion to electronic processes
- Fear of people "falling through the cracks"
- Staff turnover
  - 2/3 of Aurora Case Management
  - Training amid crisis:
    - Filling an increased community need through decreased agency staff
    - Socially distanced & remote
- Large Funding Awards through Reimbursement
- Bruise on Landlord relations

# Strengths

- COLLABORATION!!!!!!
- People assisted with large amounts of financial aid
- Navigating changing systems
  - Seasoned workers revived with new challenges and solutions
  - Funding to help in a BIG way
- Staff turnover
  - Identified agency weaknesses to build stronger organization
  - Hired amazing staff that were "born in the fire"
- Front-End funding, supported by local community, provided until reimbursement arrived
- Given an opportunity to introduce our services to a new batch of landlords

# Where we are today

- COLLABORATION!!!!!!
- Office access returning to normal
- Anticipating new wave of HP need
  - Moratorium coming to an end
  - Unemployment Benefits reducing
- Rapid Rehousing
  - Reduced landlord stock
  - Change in resources stalled potential RRH graduates- extended services
- Front-End funding supported by local community returned
- Grateful to be alive

# ESG-CV Grants Status Report Updated June 24, 2021



97.5% of funds obligated in IDIS
5 ESG-CV 1 and 40 ESG-CV 2
grants remaining to load

73% of funds Committed

11% of awarded funds Drawn

Of 362 grant recipients:

23 recipients have no funds in IDIS

41 recipients have not drawn any amount for ESG-CV funds in IDIS
