




Homelessness Unit Disproportionately Affected Populations Team COVID-19 Response


A revision was made on 4/21/2020 to reflect the following:

Identifies changes to procurement processes to be more inclusive of smaller community-based organizations and those led by people of color

2. Advancing Racial Equity through Assessments and Prioritization

Identifies strategies to advance racial equity and dismantle embedded racism in CE assessment and prioritization processes

3. <u>Rehousing Activation and Racial Equity</u>

Explains the foundation of racial equity as it relates to rehousing activation and COVID

4. Data & Equity: Using the Data You Have

Identifies tools for analyzing homelessness data related to equity, demographics, and system performance.

5. <u>Equity Capacity Building: Hiring, Supervision, Training</u>

Identifies ways that organizations can strengthen internal equity practices



The Work of Racial Equity

- COVID-19 has amplified the historic and current racial biases and discrimination embedded in our systems, processes, and practices.
- People most harmed by COVID, housing instability and homelessness include racial minorities, especially Black and Indigenous people, those who are elderly, and those who have health problems, especially respiratory problems.
- The SNAPS Office is committed to working with CoCs and ESG grantees and supporting communities advancing their efforts to be more equitable and to close racial disparities.



Key General Administrative Requirements for All HUD Grantees

Compliance with Non-discrimination and Related Requirements:

- Compliance with Fair Housing and Civil Rights Laws
- Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing
- Economic Opportunities for Low-and Very Low-income Persons (Section 3)
- Improving Access to Services for Persons with Limited English Proficiency (LEP)
- Accessible Technology



Key General Administrative Requirements for All HUD Grantees

Equal Access to Housing Regardless of Sexual Orientation or Gender Identity

- Ensure Participation of Small Disadvantaged Businesses, and Women-Owned Business
- Accessibility for Persons with Disabilities
- Violence Against Women Act
- Conducting Business in Accordance with Ethical Standards
