AFFH Rule Specific Requirements


- Once an AFH is submitted and accepted by HUD, grantee must incorporate the AFH into the consolidated planning process
- Failure to incorporate these elements puts a grantee at risk of having a plan disapproved by HUD



How AFH Information Flows




Consultation and Citizen Participation



- Consistent with 24 CFR Part 91.200(b) & 220(b)
- Required Consultations
 - Category 1: Community-based and regionally-based organizations that represent protected class members
 - Category 2: Organizations that enforce fair housing laws, such as fair housing enforcement agencies
 - PHAs operating in the jurisdiction on strategies for affirmatively furthering fair housing, and on proposed actions to affirmatively further fair housing in Consolidated Plan




Consultations on Consolidated Plan shall specifically seek input into how the goals identified in the AFH inform the priorities and objectives of Consolidated Plan



Optional Consultation

 Consultation with regional government agencies in addition to adjacent units of general local government and local government agencies, including local government agencies with metropolitanwide planning and transportation responsibilities, particularly for problems and solutions that go beyond single jurisdiction







Disproportionate Housing Need

- Already undertaken in the AFH
- Grantees do not need to duplicate in Consolidated Plan
 - Grantees should leave NA-15, 20, 25 or 30 screens blank
 - Leaving screens blank, will result in quality check error
 - Grantees can ignore these error messages




Disproportionate Housing Need



Strategic Plan

SP-10, SP-25, SP-45 and SP-80 screens



Goals - SP-45

Grantees must:

 Include all goals identified in the AFH that are intended to be initiated or completed during Consolidated Plan period in the Strategic Plan

Collaborative Joint or Regional AFHs:

 Include only those AFH goals for which you are one of the responsible entities, rather than all goals listed in the AFH





Priority Needs and Contributing Factors

- Each AFH contributing factor associated with an AFH goal should be entered into the Consolidated Plan priority needs table
- Grantees will also continue to enter Con Plan priority needs
 - If contributing factor is also a priority need, you do not need to enter it twice
- Grantees can distinguish between a contributing factor and a priority need by how you title AFH factors
 - e.g. AFH Factor: Location and Type of Affordable Housing

Goals – SP-45 – Types of Goals

AFH goals are divided into two categories:

- 1. AFH goals that are tied to consolidated plan priorities (ex: Lack of Public Investment in Specific Neighborhoods)
- 2. AFH goals not tied to consolidated plan priorities (ex: fair housing task force, review of city ordinances)



AFH Goals Tied to Con Plan Priorities


- Be assigned a Consolidated Plan priority need
- Include strategies and actions that implement the AFH goal
- Include metrics and milestones included in the AFH
- Include an outcome, and proposed accomplishments
- Complete all other required fields
- If needed, provide additional narrative on strategies and actions that will be undertaken to affirmatively further fair housing







AFH Goals Not Tied to Con Plan Priorities


- Include strategies and actions intended to be completed during consolidated plan period

- Complete all other required fields



Geographic Priorities – SP-10

May include any area targeted in the AFH you would like to highlight in the Consolidated Plan, subsequent Action Plans and CAPERs such as R/ECAP area

As much as possible, the name used in the AFH should match the name provided in the Consolidated Plan



Monitoring – SP-80

The grantee must:

 Describe the standards and procedures you will use to monitor activities carried out including the strategies and actions that address fair housing issues identified in the AFH



The grantee may:



Annual Goals – AP-20


- All Strategic Plan goals being addressed during the program year must be included as an Annual Goal
 - This includes ALL GOALS (including AFH Only goals)




- AFH goals receiving CPD funds must be documented as a project
- Include enough detail for each project so that a reasonable person would be able to determine
 - What the project is (i.e. what the jurisdiction is doing)
 - · Where the activity will be located
 - Who will benefit and why they will benefit (elderly, renters, low-income)
 - The project is an eligible use of the proposed funding source
- Each project must be associated with:
 - one or more contributing factor or priority need, and
 - one or more goals
 - Must describe planned accomplishments and indicate target date for realizing the accomplishment













