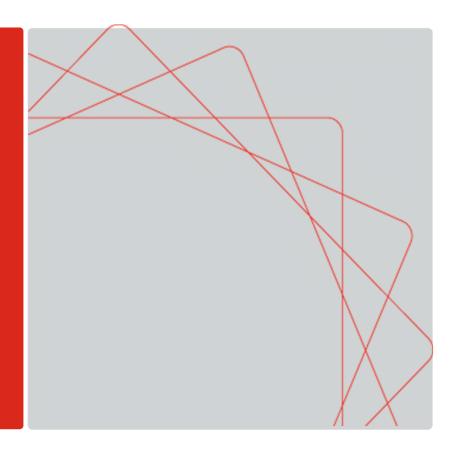

Introductions - PHAs



Poll: Which flexibilities are you planning to implement?

- PS between 80-90% or 110-150% of the SAFMR
- PS between 80-90% or 110-120% of FMR.
- Vacancy loss up to one-month rent for HCV to HCV rental
- Vacancy loss up to one-month rent for non-HCV to HCV rental
- Damage claim up to two months contract rent
- Signing bonus of up to one month of contract rent
- Pre-qualifying unit inspections
- Alternative inspection schedule, at least every 3 years
- Alternative inspection schedule, eliminate initial inspection

Evaluation Overview



- The goals of the evaluation are to:
 - Understand how PHAs implemented the MTW landlord incentives
 - Evaluate the impact of MTW landlord incentives on the housing choice voucher program
 - Estimate the cost implications of the incentives

Evaluation Outcome Measures



We will assess impacts across three domains:

- 1. Landlord willingness to accept vouchers
- 2. Landlord participation in the HCV program
- 3. Tenants' success in leasing using vouchers

Outcome Domain: Landlord Willingness



- Landlord willingness to rent to voucher holders
- Number of landlords on PHA lists

Outcome Domain: Landlord Participation



- Number of new landlords per 100 new vouchers
- Number of landlords per 100 vouchers
- Dispersion of voucher units
- De-concentration of assisted housing
- Types of landlord in voucher program

Outcome Domain: Tenant Success in Leasing



- Leasing success rates
- Time between first issuance and eventual lease-up for successful voucher holders

Evaluation Design



- Process study uses qualitative data, analysis
- Impact study uses quasi-experimental design
 - "Treatment" PHAs: 29 MTW Landlord Incentive cohort PHAs
 - "Comparison" PHAs: 116 non-MTW Landlord Incentive PHAs (4 per MTW PHA, matched on several dimensions)
- Cost analysis examines financial implications
- A Resident Advisory Group will bring a livedexperience lens to data collection, interpretation

Evaluation Data from PHAs



Site Visits in Fall 2022

- Learn about incentives planned and PHA operations that may affect implementation
- Obtain PHA data: lists of landlords, success rates

Telephone Interviews in 2023

Learn about implementation progress

Site Visits in Spring 2025

- Learn about incentives implemented, costs, updated data
- Interview participating and non-participating landlords to learn about their understanding of incentives and impacts

PHA Involvement

PHA Involvement



- Provide data, prepare for and participate in site visit interviews
- Confirm success rate data
- Provide PHA's lists of landlords
- Participate in telephone interviews
- Help recruit landlords for landlord interviews
- Provide data on costs of landlord incentives
