El Paso Collaborative for Community and Economic Development

JoAnna Guillen

NSP Administrator - El Paso Collaborative for Community & Economic Development (EPC)

- 4 Member Consortium
- \$10.1MM in NSP2 Competitive Funding, \$7.3MM in PI
- Primarily single-family acq-rehab with homebuyer assistance
- Shifting real estate market





Regular Conversations & Clear Milestones

- Standing quarterly consortium meetings
- One-on-One meetings with consortium members
- Email updates on expenditures, unit status and items of concern
- Weekly internal meetings
 and tracking





Stepping in to Support Partners


- Identifying and communicating capacity gaps
- Taking on greater responsibility in the development process
- Maintaining a positive working relationship
- Meetings with consortium member boards as necessary

Simplifying the Development Process

- Standardized closing process
- 100% development financing
- Simple homebuyer assistance calculation
- Property status tracking system

EPC's Success

- 133 houses acquired
- Permanent affordable housing for 124 households
- \$7,100,000 in program income generated
- A program that stands the test_O f time
- Helping City of El Paso





Adams County, Colorado

<u>Claire Mannato</u> Administrator: Community & Neighborhood Resources, Adams County



- NSP 1 & 3 Grantee
- \$7.1MM in NSP1, 2.5MM NSP3 & \$3MM in PI
- Single-family acq-rehab, homebuyer assistance and small multi-family development

Making NSP Work

Launching our NSP program required:

- Flexibility
- Communication
- Consistency

Streamlining the Payment Process

Obstacle: payment process was too cumbersome to implement timely.

Solution:

- Online drop box to coordinate process
- Reduce the layers of internal review
- Simplify required documentation
- Provide checklists for the sub-grantee
- Write out the entire process

Internal Coordination for Closing

Obstacle: Actions by multiple departments were necessary to close on a house

Solution:

- Create standard closing documents
- Notify other departments as early as possible
- Develop relationships with third party vendors

Working Through Stalled Projects

Obstacle: Single-family re-development stalled because of change in local zoning requirements

Solution:

- Pull in additional funding
- Work with the sub-grantee to get through the zoning process
- Adjust the development plan to a duplex

NSP Impact in Adams County

- Program Income \$3MM
- Targeted specific communities with NSP-3
- Better tracking in DRGR







New Orleans Redevelopment Authority

Lois Colson-Casey

Program Manager, New Orleans Redevelopment Authority



- 14 Member Consortium
- \$29.7MM in NSP2 Competitive Funding, \$4.6MM in PI
- All eligible NSP Activities, except Acquisition and Financial Mechanisms



Pre-Purchasing Materials

- Sub-grantee interested in purchasing building materials for houses not yet under construction (SIPS panels, solar panels, lumber)
- Set policies to minimize cost and risk:
 - Sub-grantee responsible for security and storage
 - Clear invoice documentation requirement
 - Additional costs for storage not eligible from NSP2
 - Only allowed purchases for approved houses



Back-up Expenditure Plans

We had multiple projects that fell behind schedule. To make sure we met the expenditure deadline we:

- Increased the NSP funding drawn during construction, generating program income
- Re-allocated program income to sub-grantees who met expenditure deadlines
- Allowed successful sub-grantees to build more units at a time

Communicating the Deadline

To help everyone understand the importance of the expenditure deadline:

- Project managers met with sub-grantees about deadlines regularly
- NORA's Executive Team met with sub-grantees who fell behind
- Emphasized the consortium was in it together: "If one sub-grantee falls short others must pick up the slack or we ALL fail'
- Notified City Council of the status of each developer publically



Billing All Administrative Costs

To make sure all staff time was reported into DRGR by the deadline:

- The accounting department pulled all time sheets and calculated the expenditure manually.
- The cost for the staff time was not drawn down until the books for that month were closed and the accounts reconciled, about a month later.

NSP Impact in New Orleans

460 housing units built, and more coming on line every day!

- NSP3 \$4.8M
- A range of NSP activities





Worked with Established Partners

- Contacted and entered into agreement with two nonprofit developers with whom we had worked in NSP1, 2 and 3.
 - Community Development for All People
 - Franklinton Development Association
- Good track records for timeliness, quality work
- Already owned property, therefore could move quickly to construction

Replaced Struggling Partners

 Re-allocated NSP3 funds from a non-performing developer to a proven non-profit developer – Habitat Mid-Ohio to work in the same NSP3 eligible area
