






Poverty in the Delta








Health Outcomes in the Delta





FY 2016 Investment Projects

Basic Public Infrastructure



• City of Bull Shoals, AR: Bull Shoals Wastewater System Improvement

DRA \$500,000 | Other Public \$7,947,700 | Total Investment \$8,447,000

Construction of a new wastewater treatment facility in Bull Shoals, AR that will replace the existing obsolete system, which if it failed would be an economic and environmental disaster in the region.

• City of Paducah, KY: Flood Wall Pump Station #2 Rehabilitation

DRA \$400,000 | Other Public \$4,104,992 | Total Investment \$4,504,992

The City of Paducah is proposing to rehabilitate pump station #2 along the Paducah Flood wall.



FY 2016 Investment Projects

Transportation Improvements



• Benton County, TN: Jones Plastic Expansion-Industrial Access Road

DRA \$150,000 | Other Public \$375,000 | Private \$3,000,000 | Total Investment \$3,525,000

The proposed project will include the construction of an industrial access road serving the new expansion of the Jones Plastic Products site in Camden, TN.

• Brookhaven, MS: Brookhaven Industrial Park Transportation Infrastructure Project

DRA \$1,250,000 | Other Public \$1,000,000 | Total Investment \$2,250,000

Repair of critical industrial access roads serving the Brookhaven Industrial Park.

FY 2016 Investment Projects

Workforce Development



• Town of Grove Hill, AL: Clarke County Regional Workforce Training Center DRA \$105,000 | Other Public \$432,125 | Total Investment \$537,125

The Clarke County School District proposes to use DRA funds to rehabilitate an existing armory for use as a workforce training center.

• El Dorado, AR: South Arkansas Community College Advanced Manufacturing Training Center (AMTC)

DRA \$200,000 | Other Public \$1,559,638 | Total Investment \$1,759,638

This project investment will construct a 9,000 square foot facility for classrooms and specialized training space to support industry-related programs for SouthArk College.



FY 2016 Investment Projects

Business Development/Entrepreneurship



• City of Carbondale, IL: Growing Southern Illinois – Strengthening the Entrepreneurial Ecosystem

DRA \$159,312 | Other Public \$39,937 | Total Investment \$199,249

The Growing Southern Illinois project will expand business development and entrepreneurship services to include mentoring, management, and access to capital in the 16 Illinois Delta counties.




