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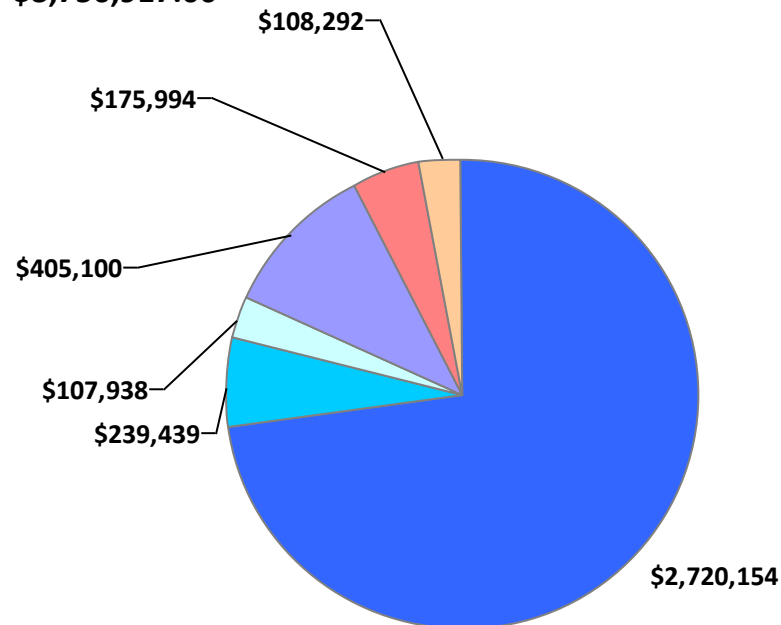

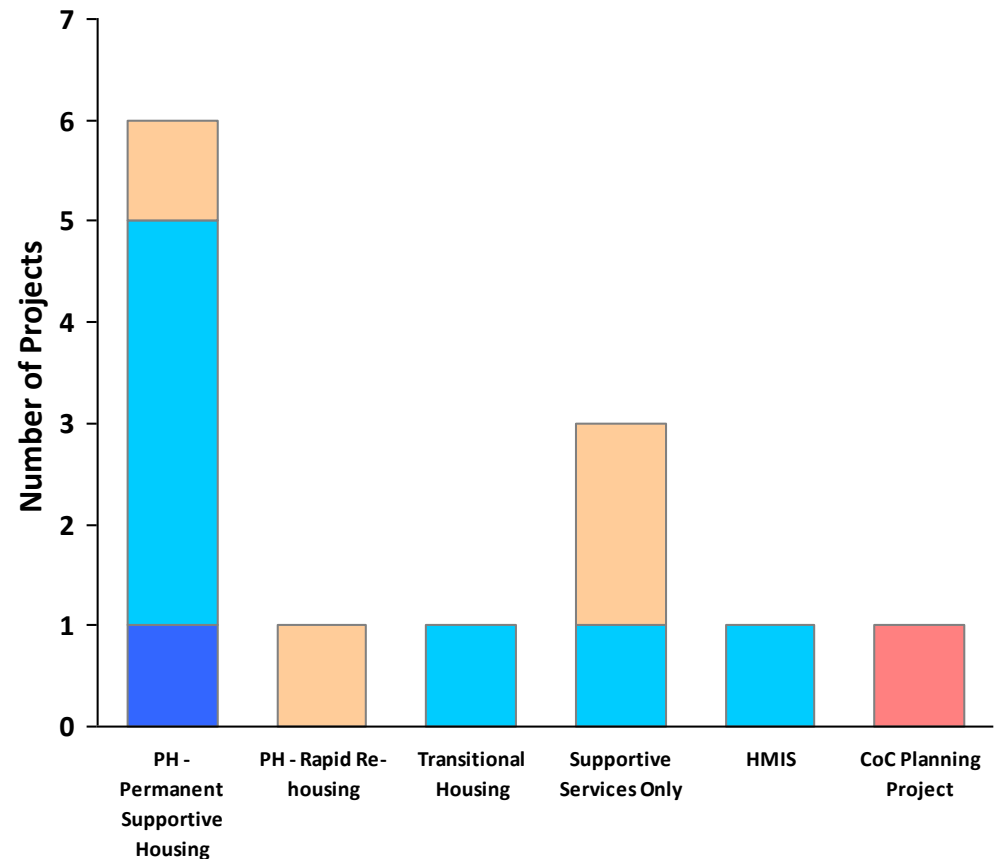

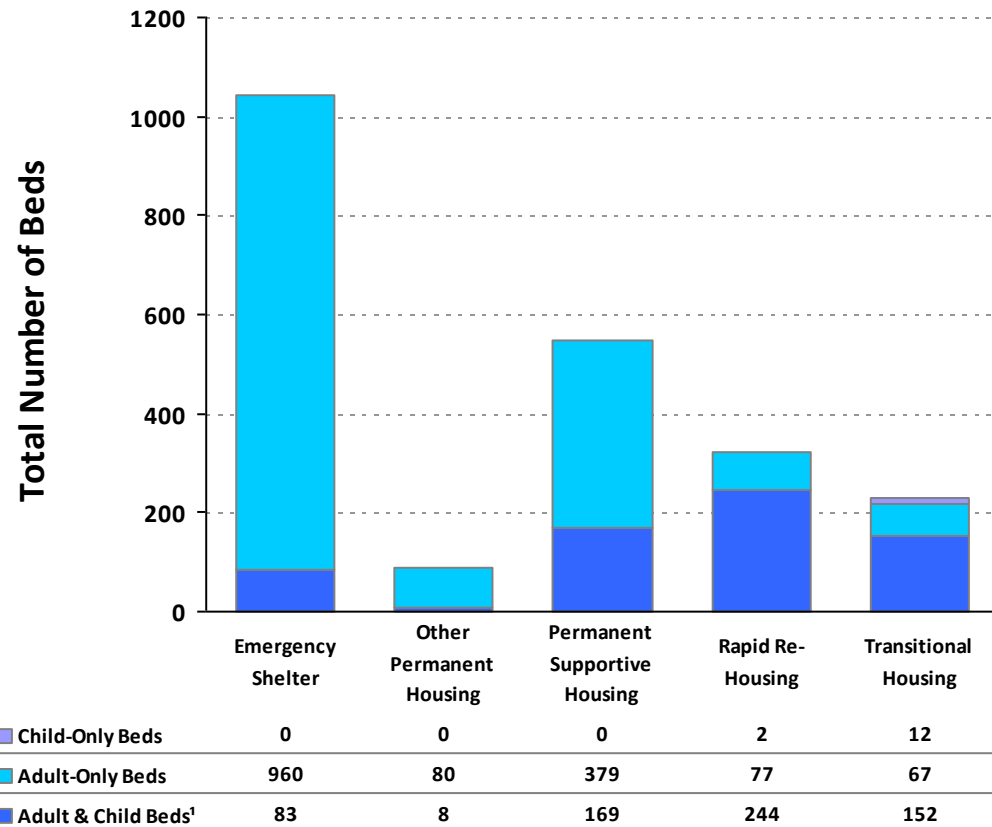
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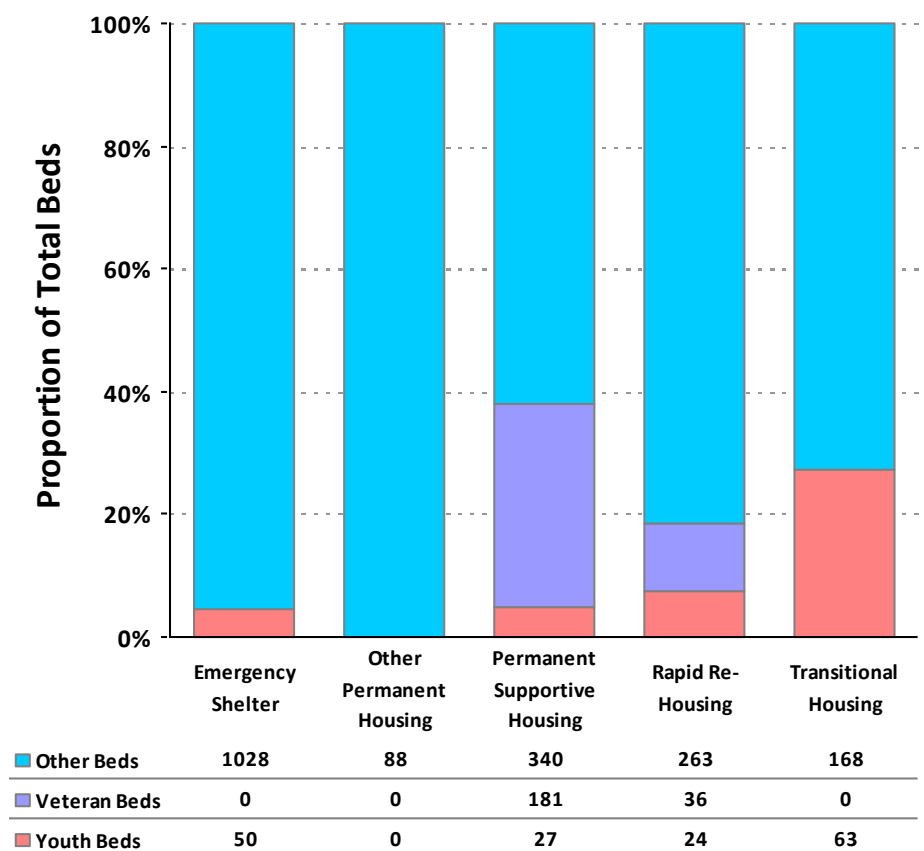
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2021 Housing Inventory Summarized by Target Population and Bed Type

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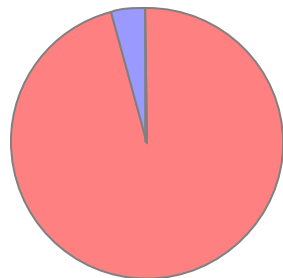
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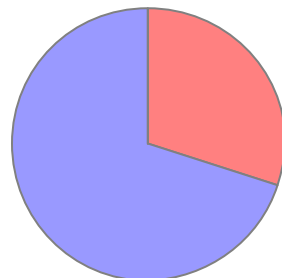
2021 Point in Time Count Summarized by Household Type

Proportion of Households Served by Program Type

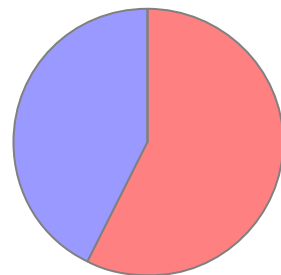

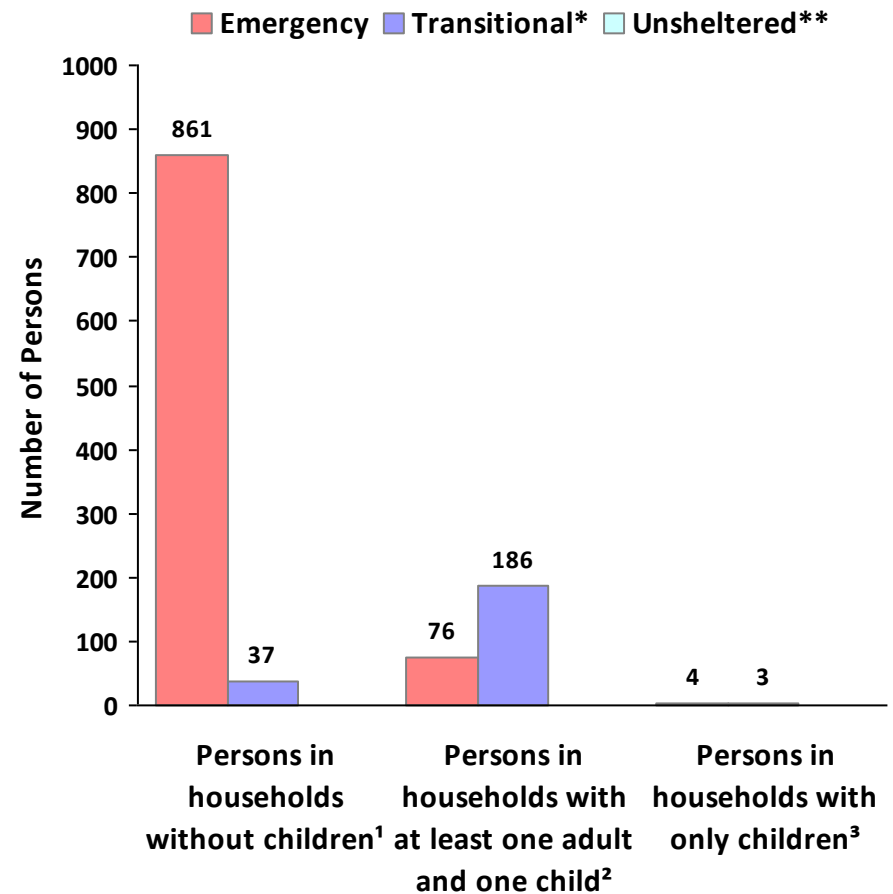

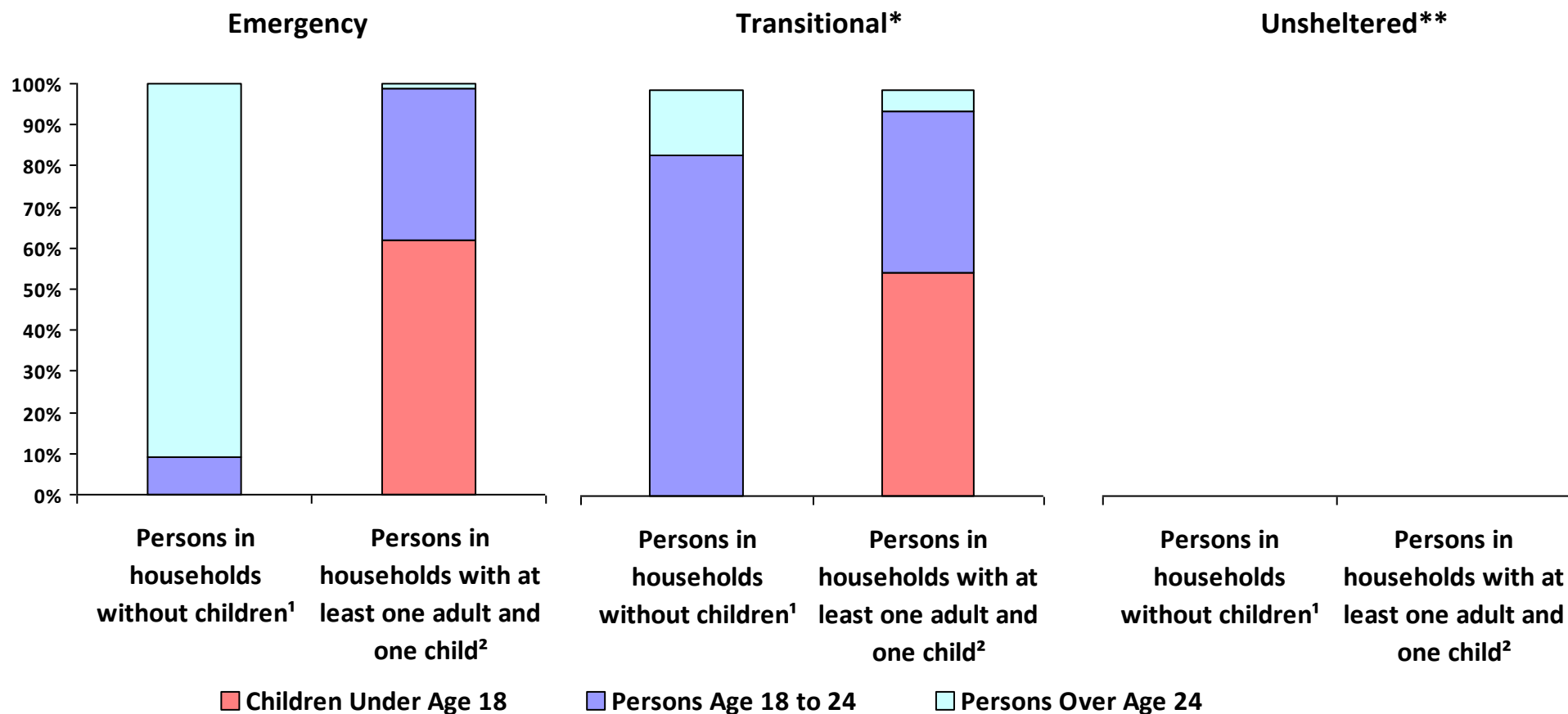


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2021 Point-In-Time Count Proportion of Persons in each Age Group by Household Type



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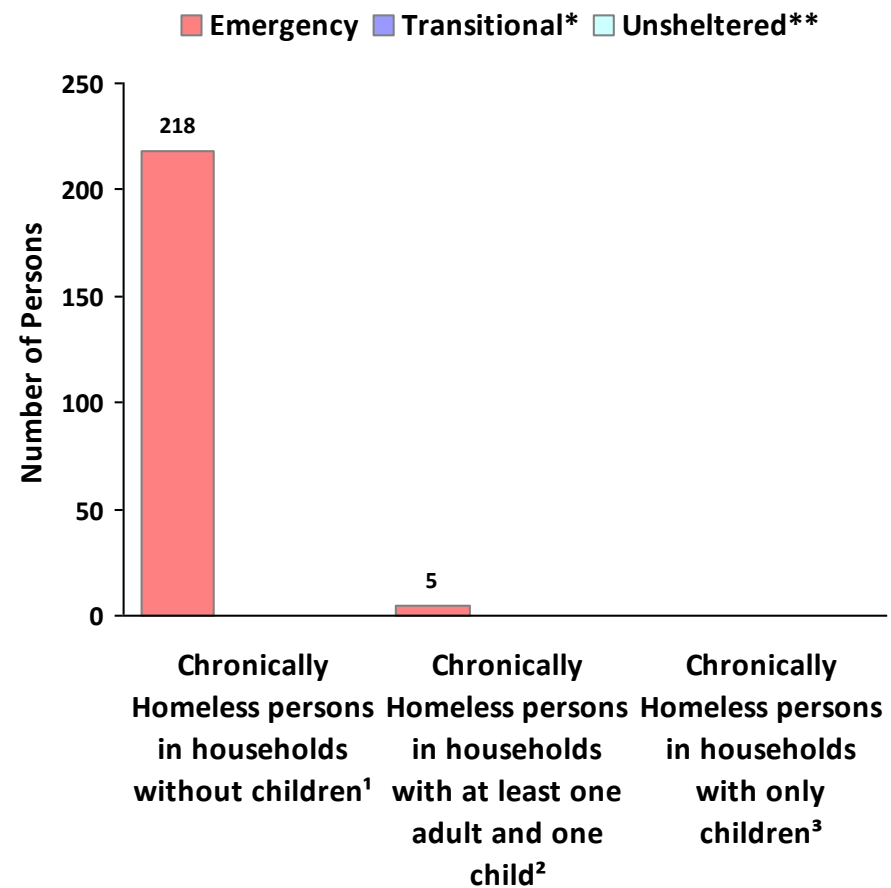
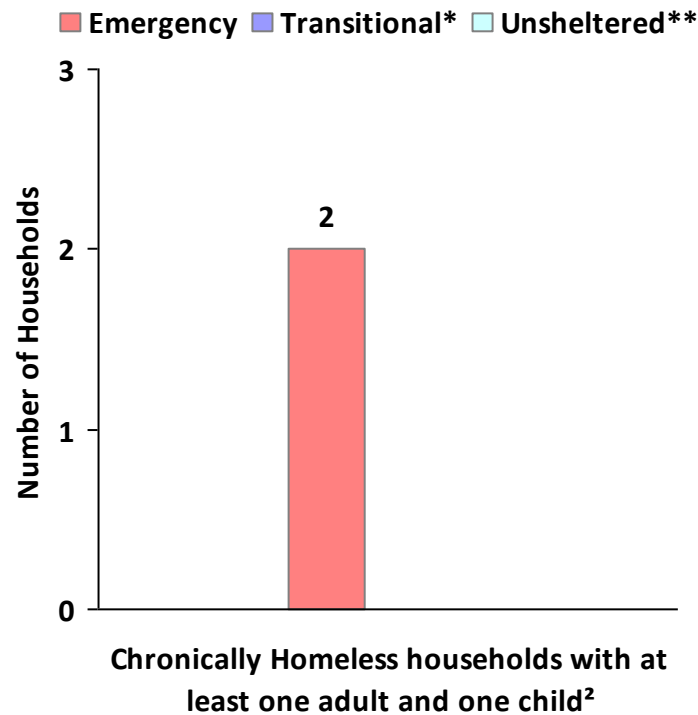


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2021 Point in Time Count Summarized by Chronically Homeless by Household Type



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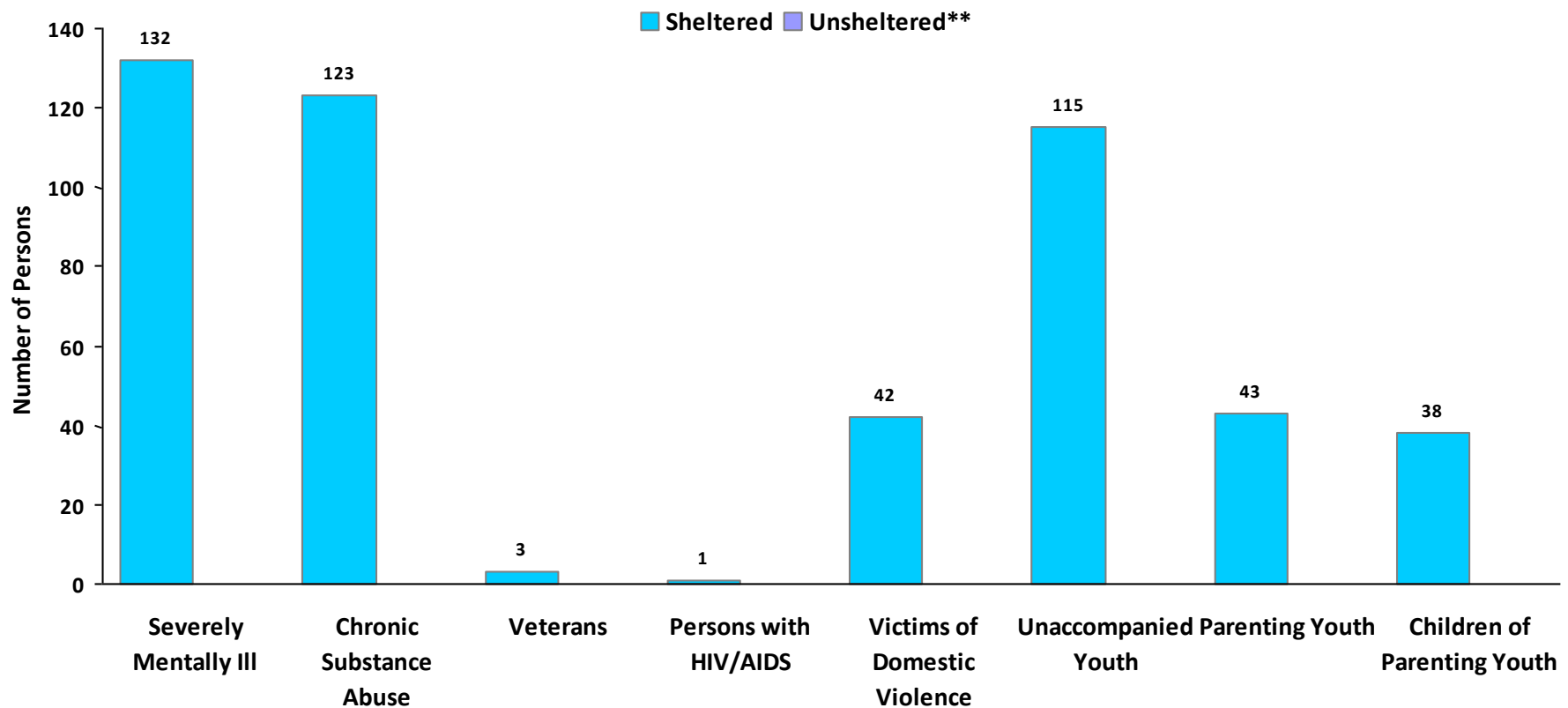


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2021 Point in Time Count Summarized by Sub-Population



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
