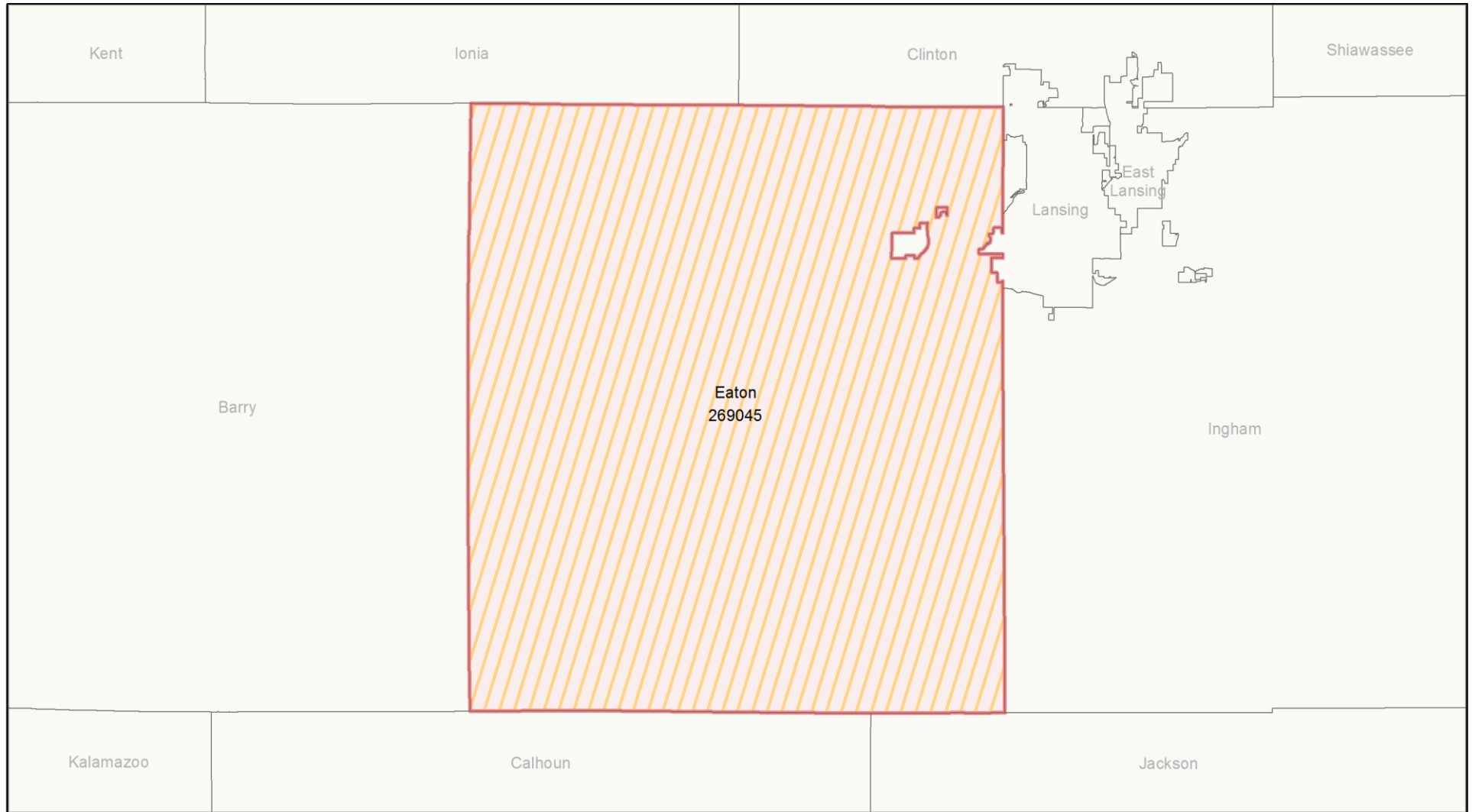

 2017 CoC Boundary  2016 CoC Boundary



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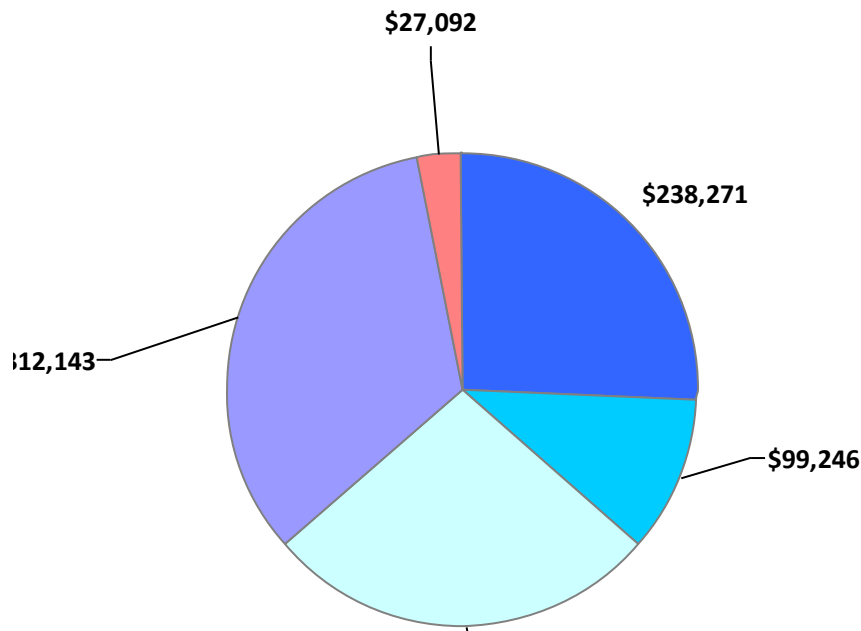

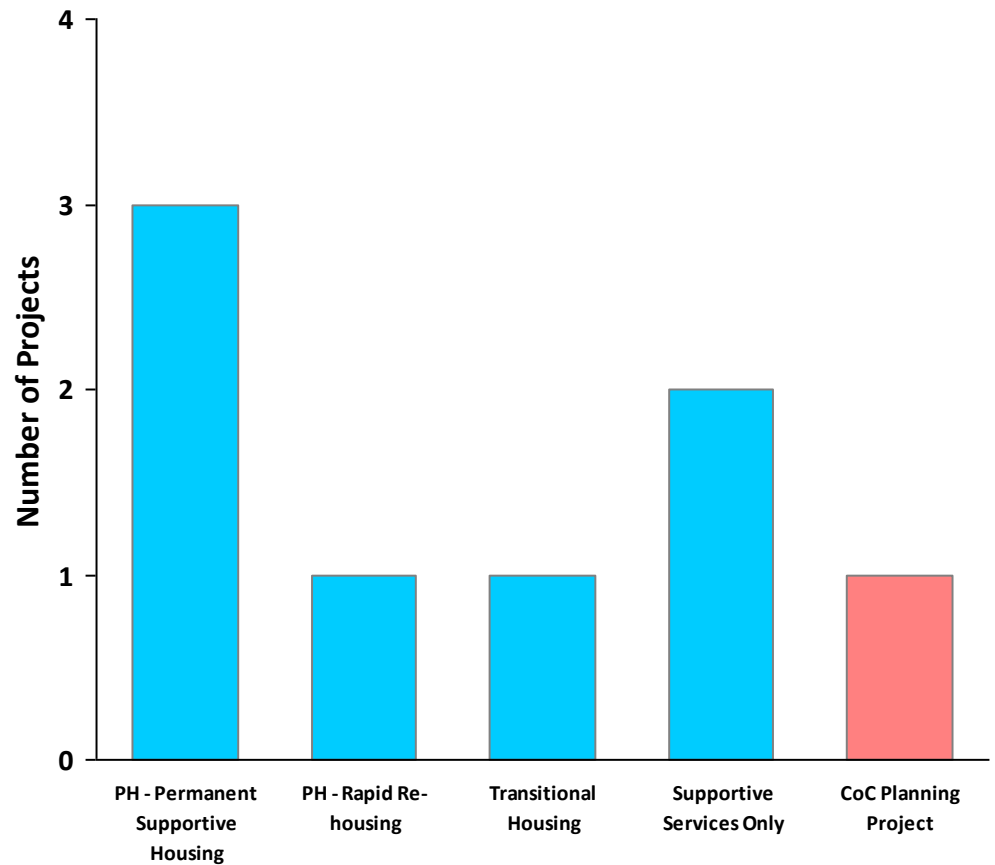

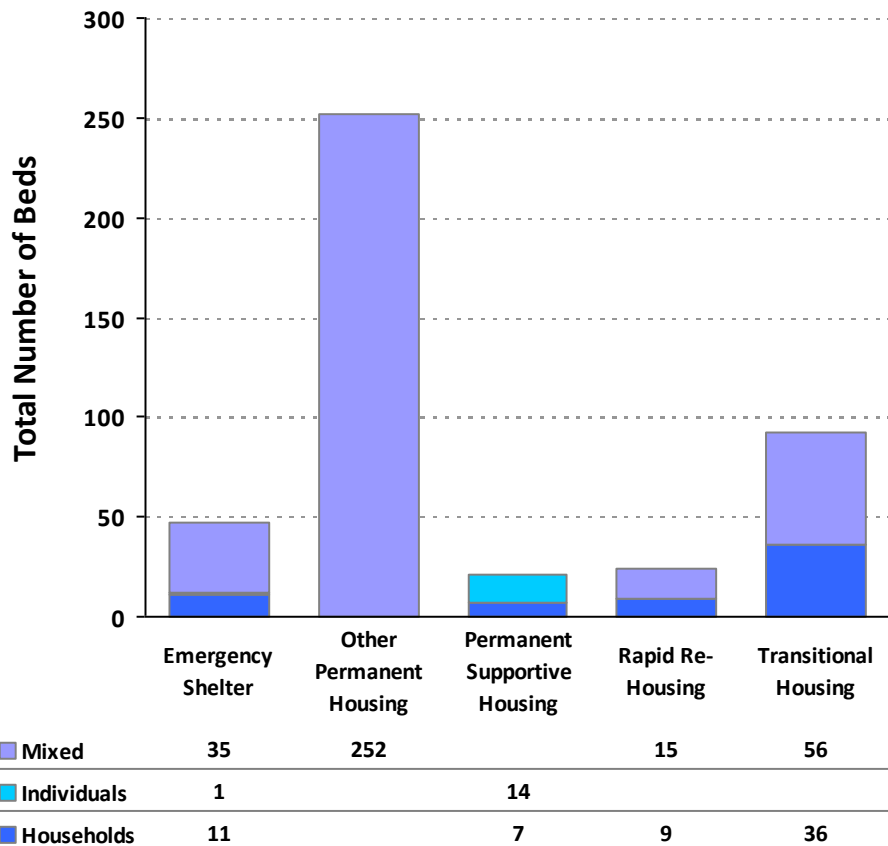

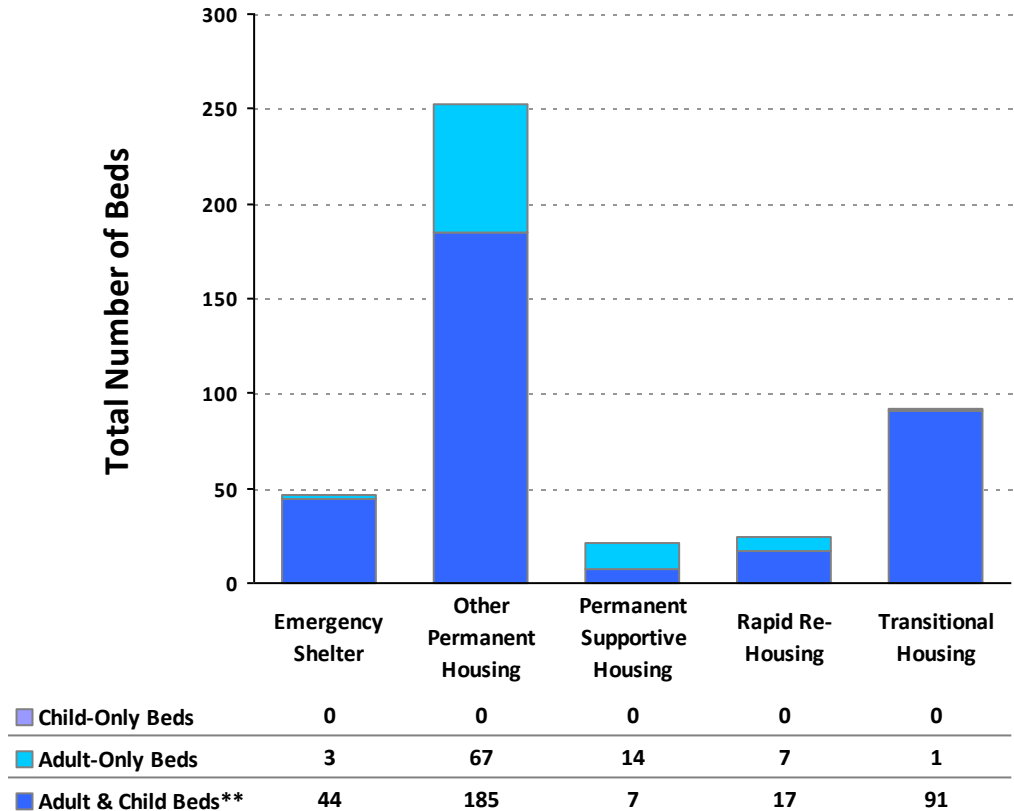

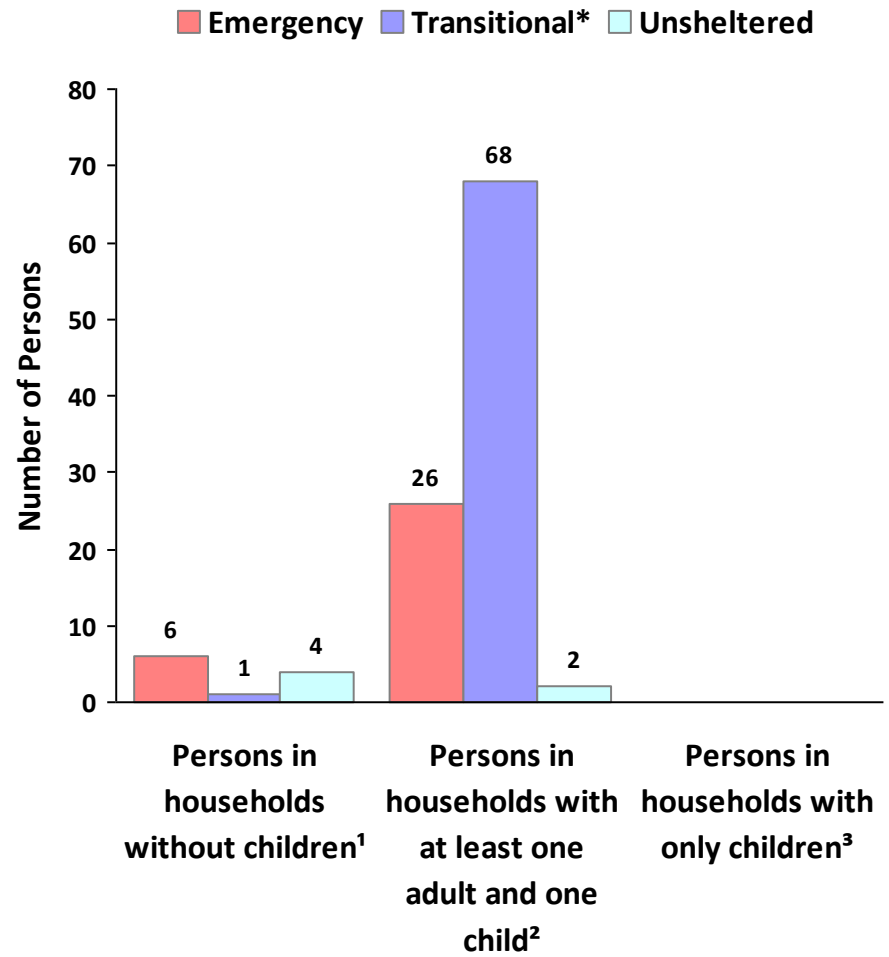
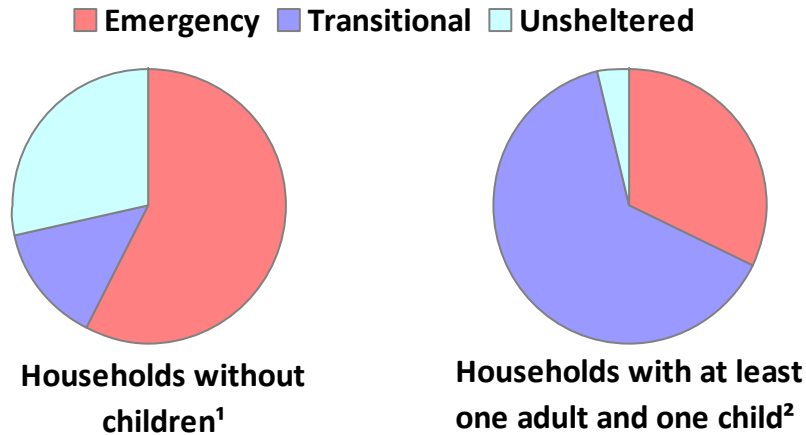

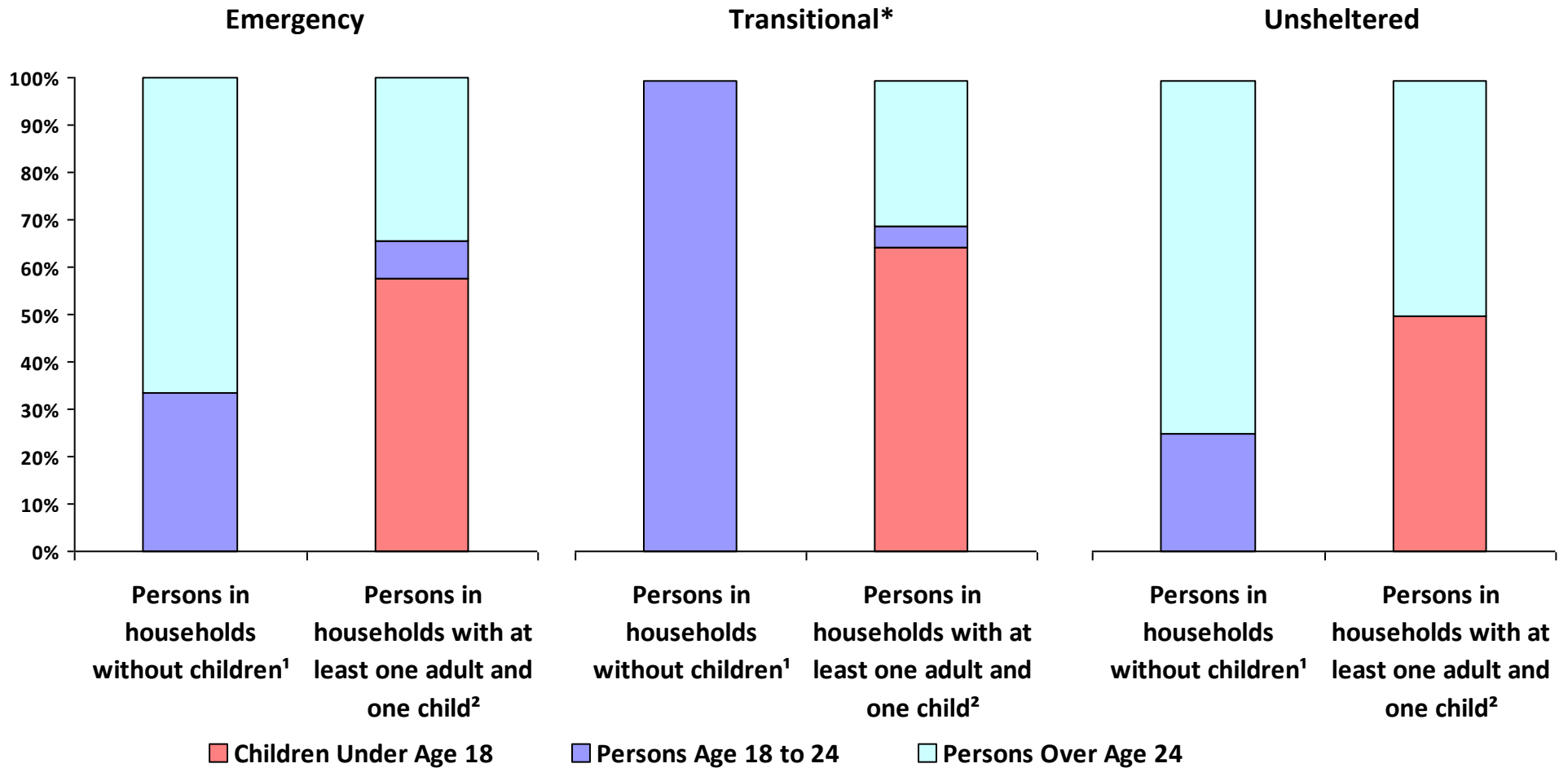

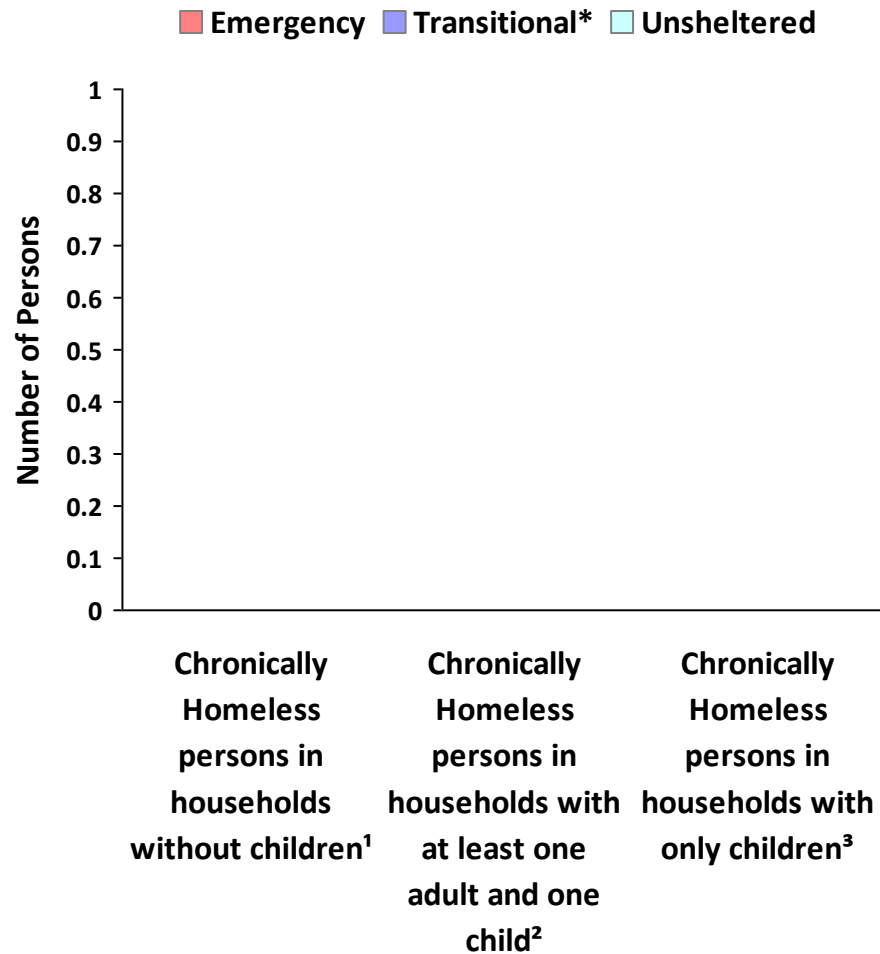
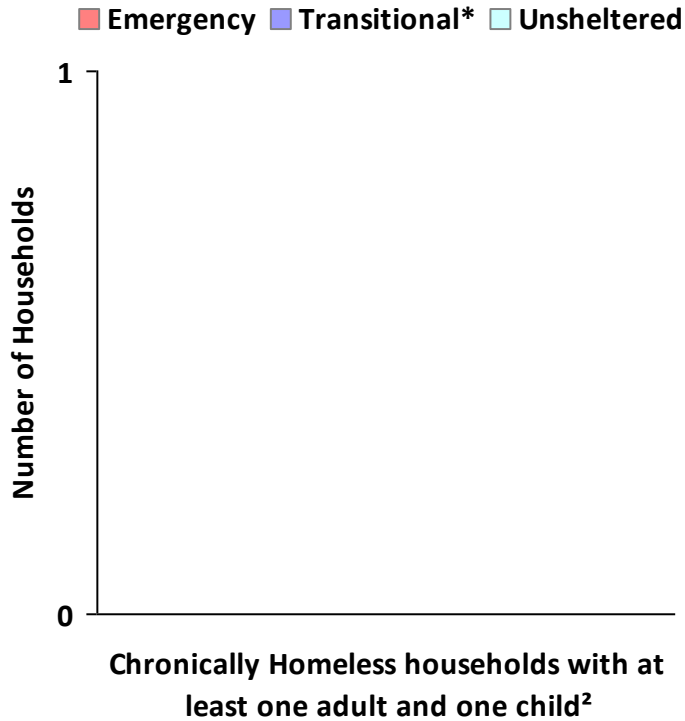
