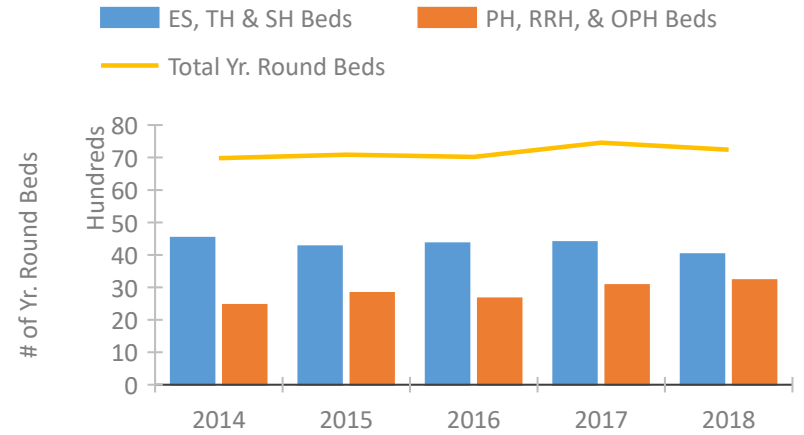

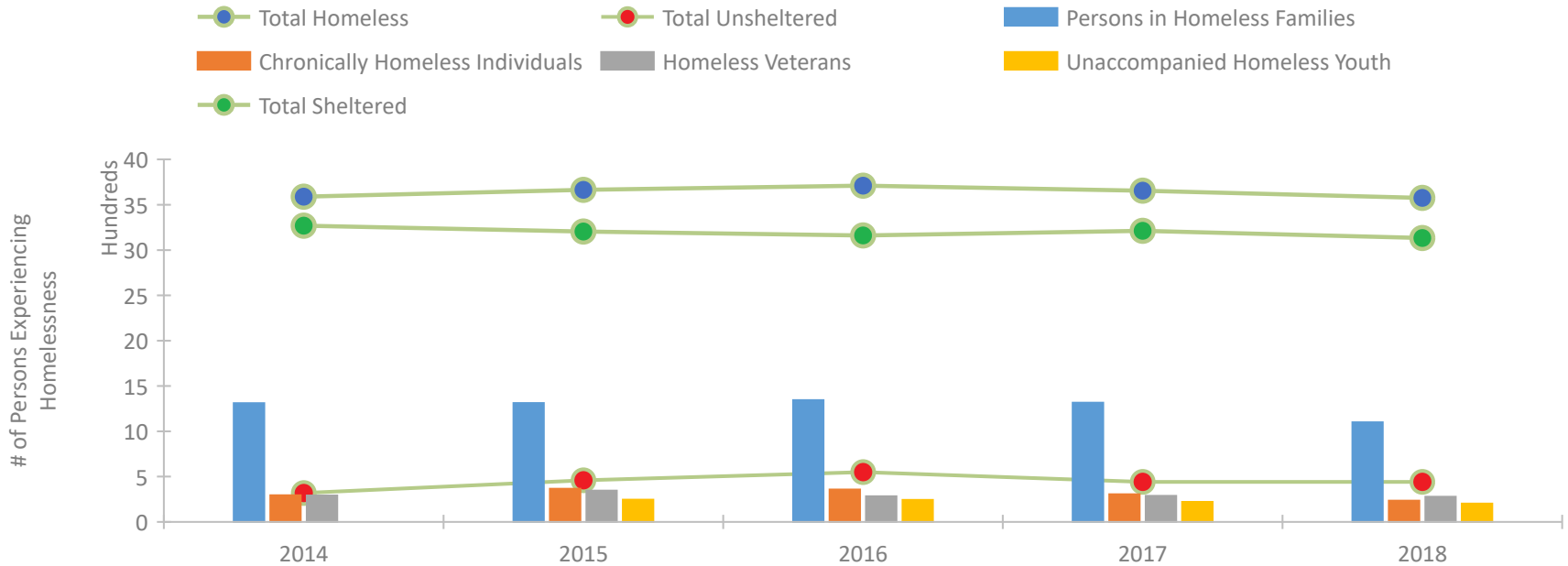

### Housing Inventory Count by Program Type

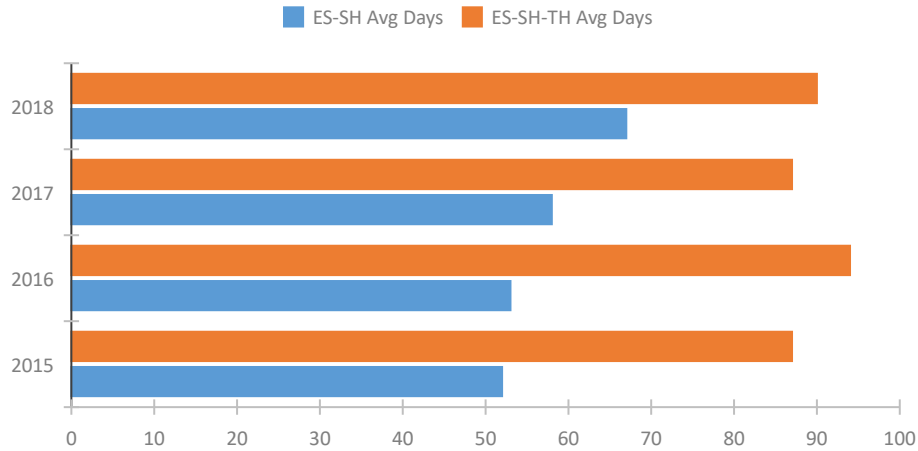


### Homeless Population – Point-in-Time (PIT) Count

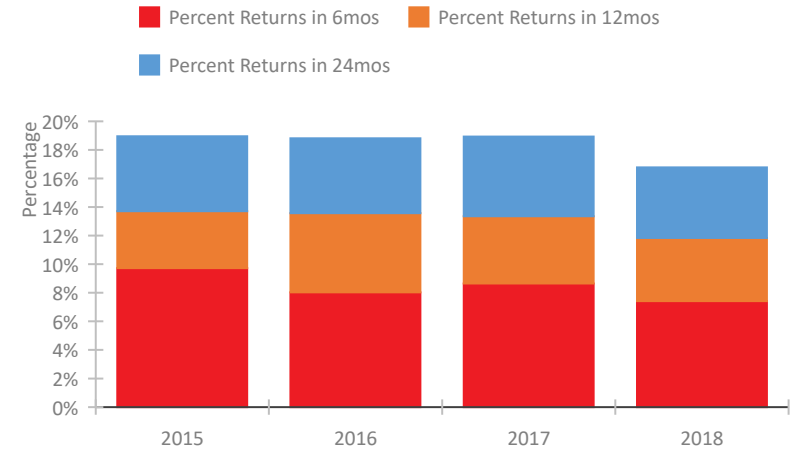

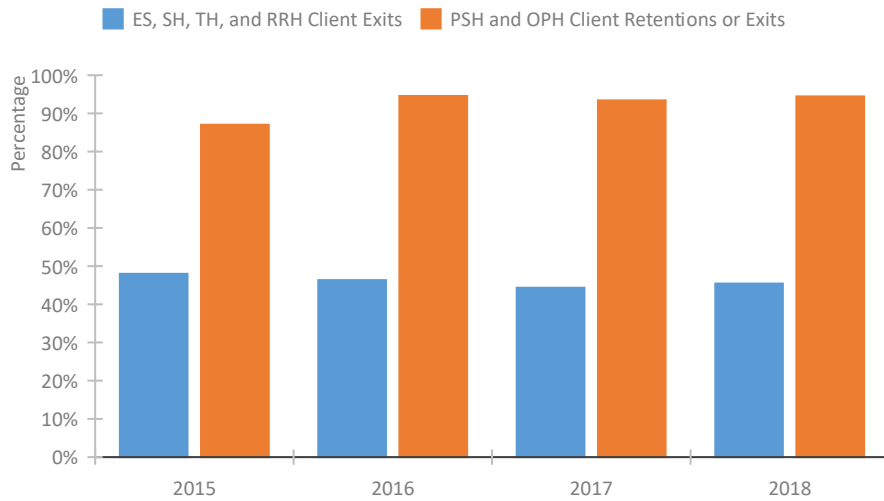
### Length of Time Homeless



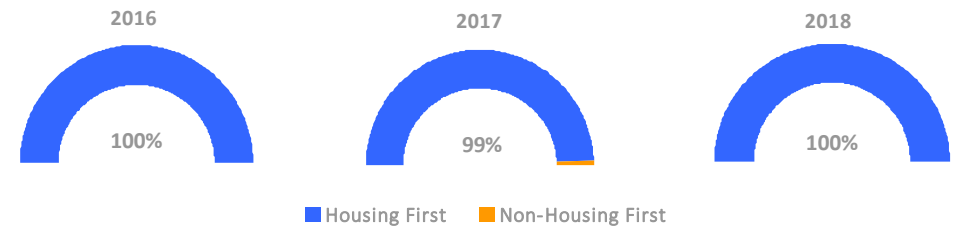
### Returns to Homelessness Over Time
