

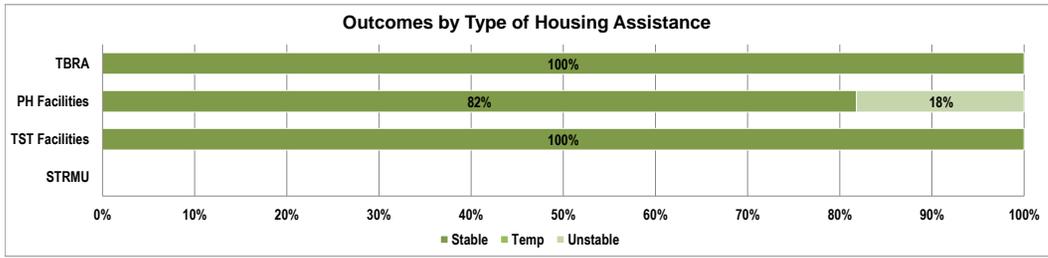

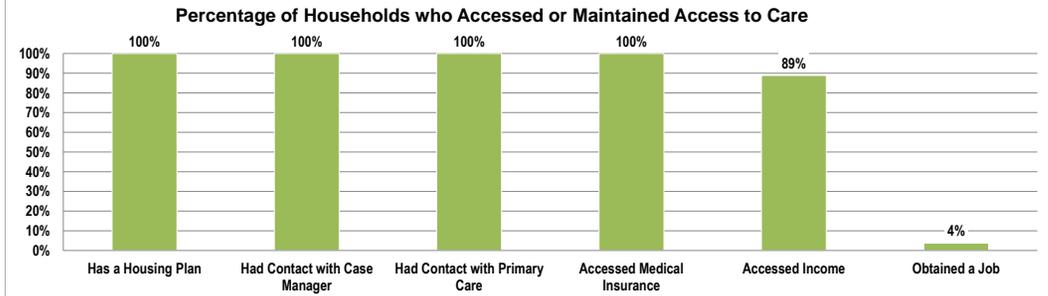

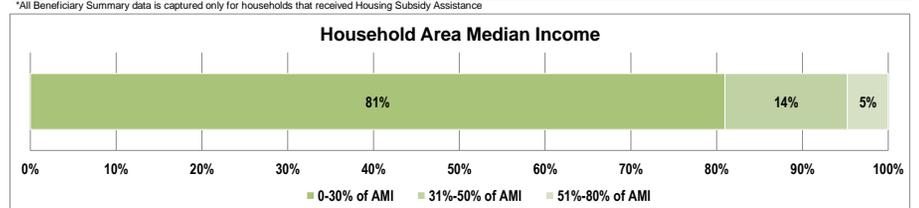

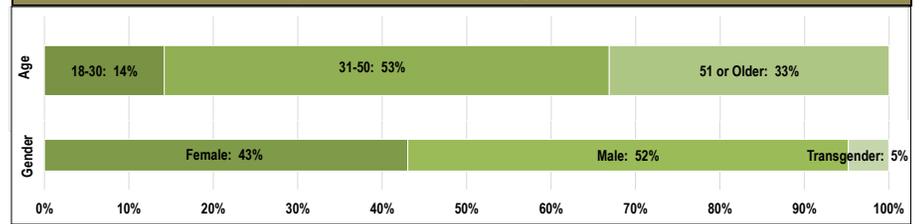

Age and Gender of HOPWA Eligible Individual



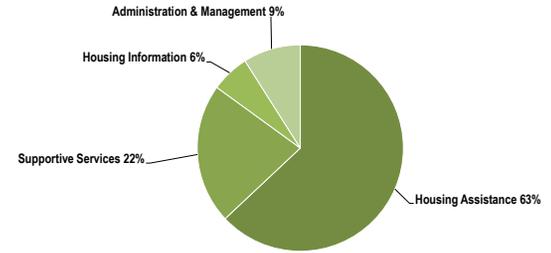

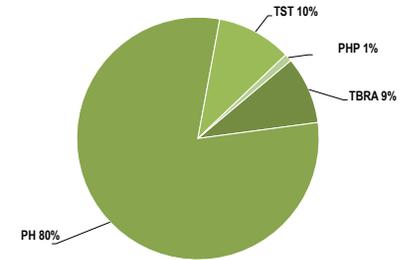

Percentage of Expenditures by Type of Activity



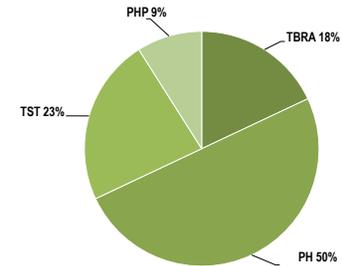
