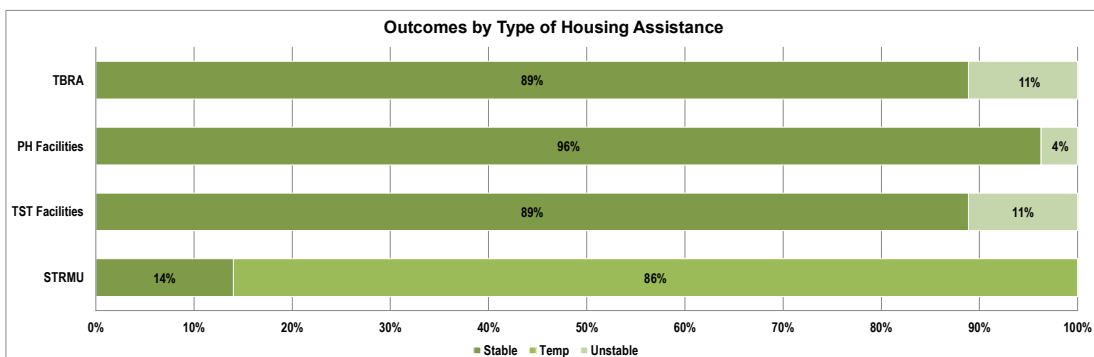

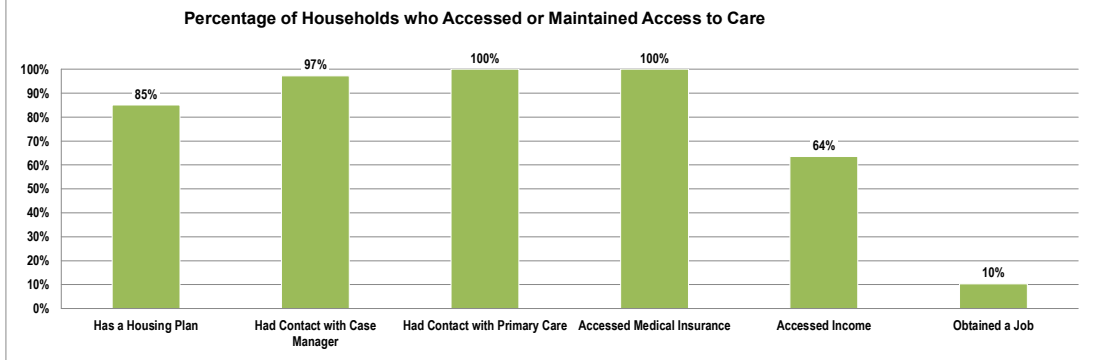

Outcomes



Outcomes by Type of Housing Assistance: TBRA (n=27) is 89% Stable, 11% Unstable. Permanent Housing Facilities (n=27) is 96% Stable, 4% Unstable. Transitional/Short Term Housing Facilities (n=9) is 89% Stable, 11% Unstable. STRMU (n=50) is 14% Stable, 86% Temporary. Outcomes do not include households where head of household died during operating year.

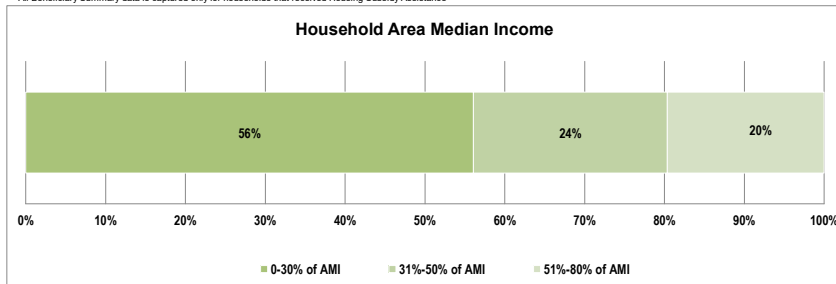

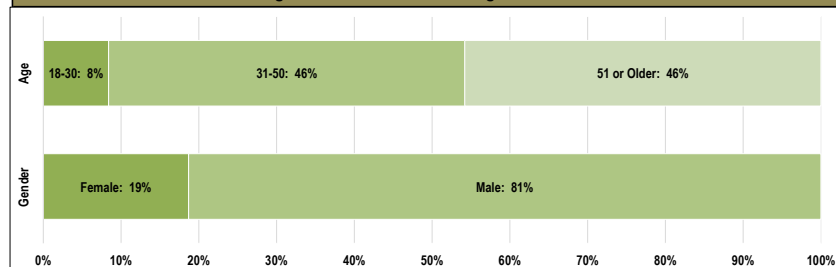
