


Outcomes by Type of Housing Assistance



Outcomes by Type of Housing Assistance: TBRA (n=19) is 95% Stable, 5% Unstable. Permanent Housing Facilities (n=7) is 100% Stable. Transitional/Short Term Housing Facilities (n=49) is 78% Stable, 6% Temporary, 16% Unstable. STRMU (n=26) is 38% Stable, 58% Temporary, 4% Unstable. Outcomes do not include households where head of household died during operating year.









Percentage of Expenditures by Type of Activity




