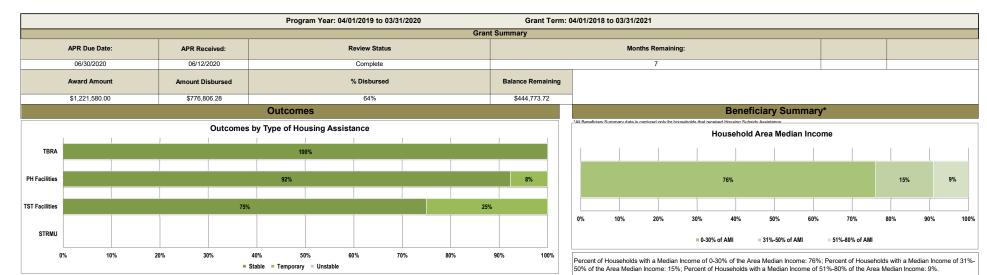
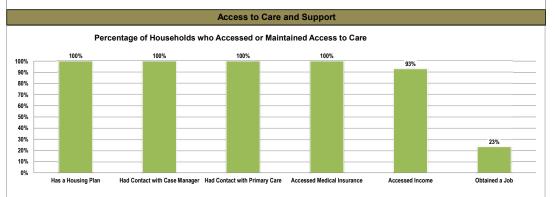
## **HOPWA Performance Profile - Competitive Grantee: Grace House MSH170016**

Number of Dependents under Age of 18 Residing with the HOPWA Eligible Individual

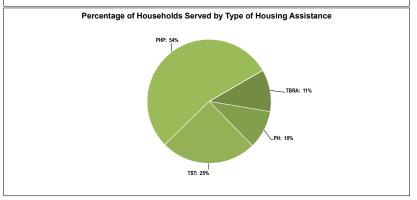
