



## Outcomes



Outcomes by Type of Housing Assistance: TBRA (n=34) is 100% Stable. STRMU (n=98) is 95% Stable, 4% Temporary, 1% Unstable. This Grantee did not provide: Permanent Housing; Transitional /Short Term Housing. Outcomes do not include households where head of household died during operating year.





## Age and Gender of HOPWA Eligible Individual







**Percentage of Expenditures by Type of Activity**




