


Outcomes



Outcomes by Type of Housing Assistance: TBRA (n=48) is 94% Stable, 6% Unstable. Transitional/Short Term Housing Facilities (n=108) is 60% Stable, 20% Temporary, 20% Unstable. STRMU (n=70) is 53% Stable, 43% Temporary, 4% Unstable. This Grantee did not provide: Permanent Housing. Outcomes do not include households where head of household died during operating year.









Percentage of Expenditures by Type of Activity




