


### Outcomes by Type of Housing Assistance



Outcomes by Type of Housing Assistance: TBRA (n=1007) is 91% Stable, 2% Temporary, 7% Unstable. Permanent Housing Facilities (n=1077) is 92% Stable, 2% Temporary, 6% Unstable. Transitional/Short Term Housing Facilities (n=697) is 84% Stable, 10% Temporary, 6% Unstable. STRMU (n=1243) is 79% Stable, 18% Temporary, 3% Unstable. Outcomes do not include households where head of household died during operating year.







**Percentage of Expenditures by Type of Activity**




