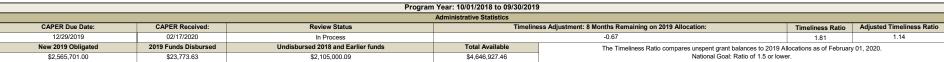
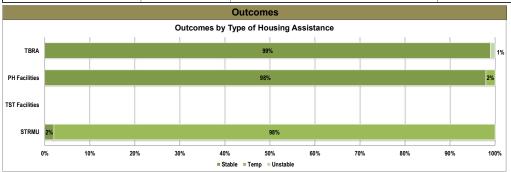
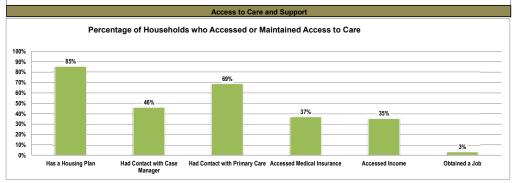
HOPWA Performance Profile - Formula Grantee: City of Baton Rouge

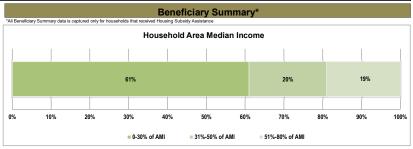

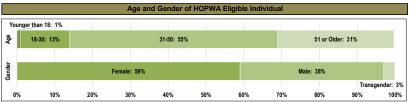

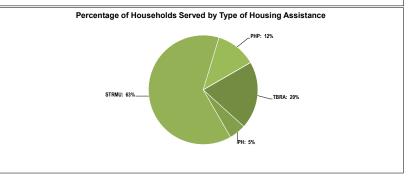
