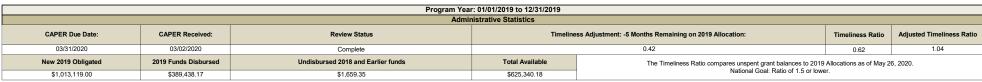
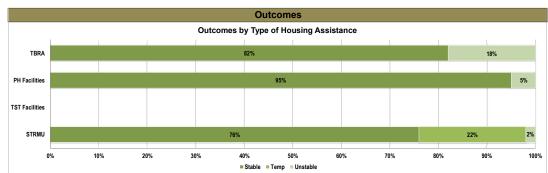
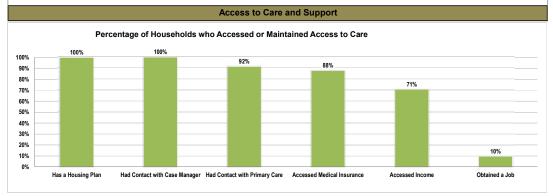
## **HOPWA Performance Profile - Formula Grantee: City of Cincinnati**

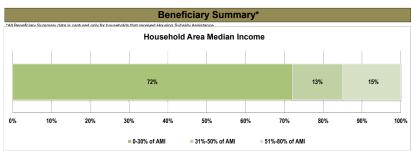

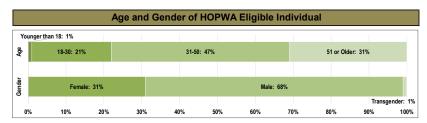

Number of Dependents under Age of 18 Residing with the HOPWA Eligible Individual

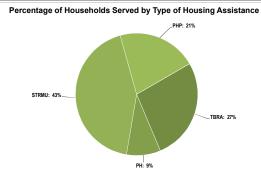
