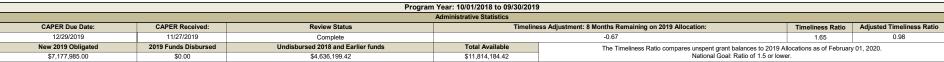
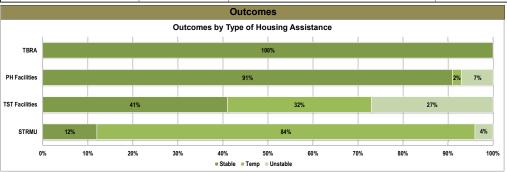
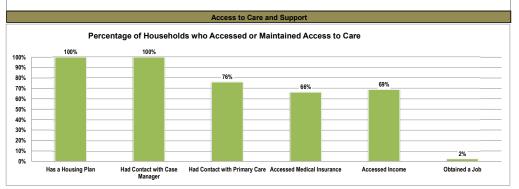
HOPWA Performance Profile - Formula Grantee: City of Fort Lauderdale

Transitional/Short Term Housing Facilities (n=145) is 41% Stable, 32% Temporary, 27% Unstable. STRMU (n=257) is 12% Stable, 84% Temporary, 4% Unstable. 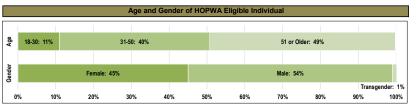

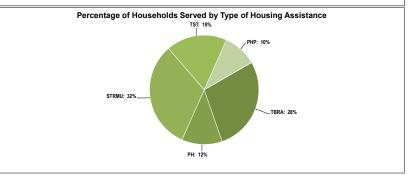
