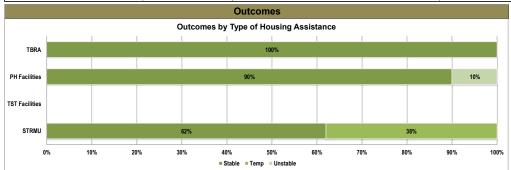
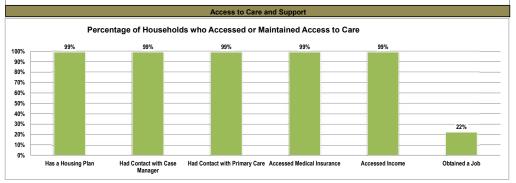
## **HOPWA Performance Profile - Formula Grantee: City of Fort Worth**

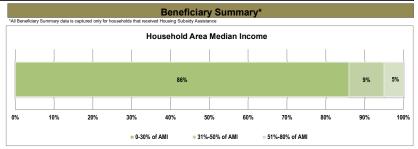

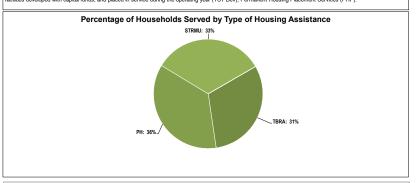
