




Outcomes by Type of Housing Assistance



Outcomes by Type of Housing Assistance: TBRA (n=53) is 91% Stable, 3% Temporary, 6% Unstable. Transitional/Short Term Housing Facilities (n=26) is 77% Stable, 3% Temporary, 20% Unstable. STRMU (n=97) is 59% Stable, 32% Temporary, 9% Unstable. This Grantee did not provide: Permanent Housing. Outcomes do not include households where head of household died during operating year.







Percentage of Expenditures by Type of Activity




