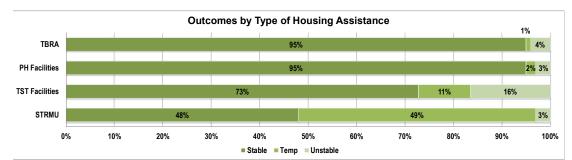

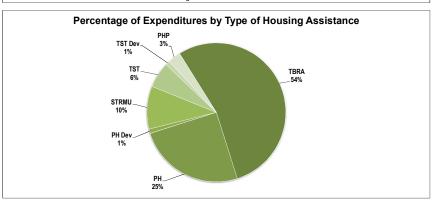

Number of Dependents under Age of 18 Residing with the HOPWA Eligible Individual

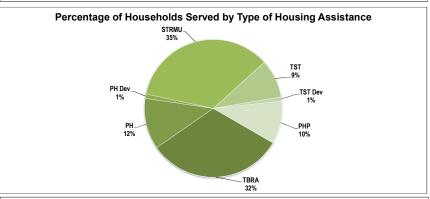
