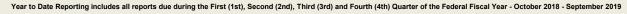
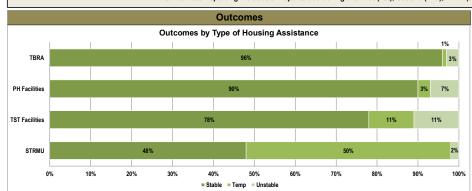
HOPWA Performance Profile - Year to Date Summary - Competitive Program

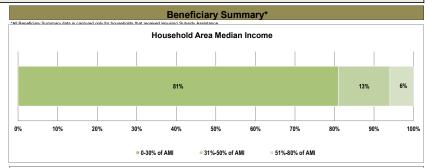
