

Overview of the MTW Cohort 1 Evaluation

Overall Approach:

 Experimental design to compare outcomes of MTW Cohort 1 designated PHAs (treatment) to nondesignated PHAs (control) supplemented by a descriptive analysis.

Overview of the MTW Cohort 1 Evaluation

- Goal: Two overarching research questions guide the evaluation:
 - What are the consequences of MTW flexibility for small PHAs and their tenants?
 - Impact Study
 - How do small PHAs use their MTW flexibility?
 - Process Study

The Impact Study

- Approach: An impact study to understand the effect of MTW on PHA and tenant outcomes.
 - Primarily uses existing data to document the characteristics, costs, and outcomes of PHAs in the study:
 - Administrative and financial data (HUD)
 - Neighborhood poverty data (ACS)
 - Employment and earnings data (NDNH)

The Impact Study

- The impact study will report on the following outcomes:
 - Average monthly cost per household served (overall and by program)
 - Average earnings for non-elderly, non-disabled adults
 - Percentage of HCV households living in low-poverty census tracts
 - Percentage of exit households with sufficient earnings
 - HCV utilization rate
 - Public Housing occupancy rate

The Process Study

- Approach: A descriptive analysis of how treatment group PHAs use their MTW flexibility to meet the MTW program's goals of increasing cost efficiency, selfsufficiency, and housing choice
 - Uses a combination of administrative and primary data collection

The Process Study

- The three main objectives of the Process Study are to:
 - Investigate what motivated you to apply for MTW designation under Cohort 1;
 - Conduct an in-depth analysis of how you use your flexibility; and
 - Document how PHAs that did not receive MTW designation pursued similar objectives

Data Included in the Process Study

Data Source	Purpose in Study
MTW Application (Baseline) Survey	PHAs' motivations for applying for Cohort 1 and the objectives and waivers they intended to pursue
MTW Plan	Updated information on how PHAs plan to use MTW authority and timeline for 1 st two years of implementation
MTW Supplement	Detailed description of the MTW waivers that PHAs plan to implement as well as local, non-traditional activities
Administrative Plans	Supplemental information on the program and policy changes that PHAs implement (reviewed as needed)
Interviews	Qualitative information on PHAs' motivations, implementation activities, and challenges with MTW



Reimbursable Software Update Grants

- Each of the 31 Cohort 1 MTW agencies will be receiving reimbursable grant awards of up to \$25,000 to help defray the costs associated with upgrading IMS/PIC software to accommodate MTW flexibilities


