# CDBG-CV ISSUE – DUPLICATION OF BENEFITS

## What is duplication of benefits?

A duplication of benefits occurs when a person, household, business, government, or other entity receives financial assistance from multiple sources for the same purpose, and the total assistance received for that purpose is more than the total need for assistance.

# CDBG-CV ISSUE – DUPLICATION OF BENEFITS (CONT.)

For CDBG-CV grants, the CARES Act provides, “That the Secretary shall ensure there are adequate procedures in place to prevent any duplication of benefits as required by section 312 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5155) and in accordance with section 1210 of the Disaster Recovery Reform Act of 2018 (division D of Public Law 115–254; 132 Stat. 3442), which amended section 312 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5155).”

# CDBG-CV ISSUE – DUPLICATION OF BENEFITS (CONT.)

- This means that if the activity has been assisted with another funding source, it cannot be assisted with CDBG-CV funds.
- Examples are:
  - Small Business Administration Paycheck Protection Program
  - The Federal Emergency Management Agency's Public Assistance Program
  - The Emergency Grant Solution Program's programs for homeless services activities.
