Overall LMI Benefit

BENEFIT STANDARD	GRANTEE TYPE	MEASUREMENT
 70 percent overall LMI benefit standard 	CDBG (Entitlement and State)	 The percentage calculation is based on aggregate CDBG expenditures over a period of up to three years specified by the entitlement grantee or State in a certification to HUD. The certification must be included in the Action Plan submission.
 At least 70 percent of all non- administrative expenditures must be for activities that meet the low- and moderate-income National Objective 	CDBG-CV (Entitlement and State)	 Calculated based on percentage of total CDBG-CV grant expended for LMI This is separate from the calculation for regular formula CDBG allocations

CDBG National Objectives – LMC



24 CFR § 570.208(a)(2)

- Activities that benefit specific individuals
- Typical Activities: emergency grant payments made directly to service providers for subsistence-type payments such as rent/mortgage and utilities, food pantry, emergency shelters for homeless persons, PPE, Internet access
- Options for meeting limited clientele:
 - 51% of participants are documented as LMI
 - Participation is limited to LMI only
 - Presumed benefit activity exclusively serves:
 - Abused children, battered spouses, elderly persons, severely disabled adults, homeless persons, illiterate adults, persons living with AIDS, and migrant farm workers
 - Nature and location of the activity indicates LMI benefit



CDBG National Objectives – LMJ



24 CFR § 570.208(a)(4)

- Activities that provide economic opportunity
- Typical activities: job creation by hiring extra cleaning staff, providing working capital loans to businesses to assist them in retaining jobs, primarily those held by or made available to low- and moderate-income persons
- In order to meet this criteria, activities must create or retain permanent jobs

AND

- 51% of the jobs created/retained must be available to or held by LMI persons
 - Jobs are counted on full time equivalent (FTE) basis



CDBG National Objectives – LMJ (Cont'd)



24 CFR § 570.208(a)(4)

- For jobs created, 51% of the jobs must be held by or available to LMI
- For jobs to be considered retained, document that jobs would be lost without CDBG and that job
 - Is currently held by LMI person OR
 - Is expected to turn over in two (2) years and will be filled by an LMI person or made available to LMI
- May be presumed LMI for jobs if:
 - Employee resides in Census tract/block numbering area (BNA) with 20% poverty and general distress; or
 - Employee resides in Census tract/BNA with 70% LMI; or
 - Business and job are located in a Census tract/BNA with --20% poverty and general distress*

*An alternative requirement in the CDBG-CV Federal Register Notice (FR-6218-N-01) eliminated the requirement that a Census Tract containing at least a portion of a central business district must have a poverty rate of 30% before residents and businesses in the tract are entitled to a presumption of LMI.



CDBG National Objectives - URG

Urgent Need

24 CFR § 570.208(c)

- Urgent need is used to address emergency situations
- Typical activities: public services for non-LMI clientele such as mortgage assistance, or health services to address a serious outbreak
- To meet the urgent need test:
 - Existing conditions pose serious & immediate threat to health/welfare of community

*The CDBG-CV Federal Register Notice establishes specific guidance to appropriately document use of the Urgent Need National Objective

Documentation Options and Flexibilities - LMC

Category	Documentation Standard	Options
 At least 51% of participants are LMI 	 Information on family size and income (e.g., income certification) 	 Verifiable self certification Income determination based on source documents / third party verification
 All participants are members of groups that are presumed to be LMI 	 Document(s) indicating the beneficiary is part of a group that is presumed to be LMI 	 Options vary depending on the group served
 The nature and location of the activity is such that it may be concluded the activity's clientele are LMI 	 Document that by nature/location of an activity, it can be concluded that the activity's clientele is primarily LMI 	 Documentation describing how the nature of the service or the location lends itself to serving primarily LMI

Recordkeeping Requirements: 24 CFR § 570.506

Documentation Options and Flexibilities - LMJ

- Normal recordkeeping requirement:
 - Document family income
- Streamlined recordkeeping requirements:
 - Individuals that apply for or hold jobs may be considered to be members of one-person families; or
 - Grantees may substitute records showing the type of job and showing that the annual wages or salary
 of the job is equal to or less than the Section 8 low-income limit for a one-person family
- For jobs to be considered held by LMI persons:
 - Must document income of LMI persons hired or have evidence of a qualifying presumption
 - Written agreement with the business to enforce requirement
- For jobs to be considered **available to** LMI persons:
 - No special skills, training, or education required
 - LMI persons must receive first consideration
 - Written agreement with the business to enforce requirement
- 51% of the actual FTE jobs filled must be held by LMI



Documentation Options and Flexibilities – LMJ (Cont'd)

Documentation Options and Flexibilities - URG

Criterion for Urgent Need

Is the activity designed to alleviate existing conditions?

Does the condition pose a serious and immediate threat to the health or welfare of the community that is of recent origin or that recently became urgent within the last 18 months?

Is the grantee unable to finance the activity on its own, and are other sources of funds not available to carry out the activity? **Documentation Options from Federal Register Notice**

The same documentation that is used to document that the CDBG-CV activity prevents, prepares for, or responds to coronavirus may be used

Documented by HHS Public Emergency Declaration, Federal Disaster Declaration, or State/local emergency declaration

The same documentation that is used to make the activity eligible for CDBG-CV may be used to document this criterion, including documentation that the activity prevents, prepares for, or responds to coronavirus, as well as documentation of compliance with Duplication of Benefits requirements



Choosing the Appropriate National Objective



Choosing a National Objective

- Determine the compatibility of a National Objective with the eligible activity by reviewing the IDIS Matrix Codes / National Objectives table available at:
 - <u>https://www.hudexchange.info/resource/2546/matrix-code-national-objective-table/</u>
- Determine the actual beneficiaries of the activity (end users)
- Consider the documentation requirements associated with the available National Objectives
- Select the National Objective that best represents the activity's benefit to the community for which adequate documentation is readily available or is most likely to be obtained
