

7/11/2014 CMS Developer Meeting Notes

1. Updated XML Schema and Reference Items:
 - Reinstated the postSubmission method and associated data structures in arm.xsd and arm.wsdl.
 - Revised text if item id=3 in group 39 Limited English Proficiency Types and group 40 Rural Area Types from "Choose not to respond" to "Chose not to respond".
 - Will notify CMS when the latest version of the XML Schema posted to:
http://portal.hud.gov/hudportal/HUD?src=/program_offices/housing/sfh/hcc/OHC_CM_S1415a.
The page shows a July 8 update but the link is currently pointing to the previous version. When this is resolved a notice will be sent to the CMS POCs.
 - The zip file contains a PDF called arm5_change_log.pdf. The file highlights the changes that have been made.
2. ARM 5.0 ICD will be posted to the same link above. It was sent to the meeting attendees. When it is posted a notice will go out to all CMS.
3. ARM 5.0 Pilot Environment: Later today the ARM Reference Web Service will be launched. It will not require authentication and will allow you to retrieve reference items. Will broadcast the ARM 5 URL to CMS POCs when it is available. The ARM service is expected to be available mid-July between the 15th – 18th.
4. HCS 9902 User Interface: The two 9902 screens were displayed during the call.

The Activity Types will be used to identify the number of All Activities and the number of activities specific to a HUD grant the agency has received.

Activity Type 4 will remain the reference value for All Activities

Currently there is only one other activity type for the 2014 Comprehensive Grant. As HUD awards more grants, new values for activity types will be added. For example, when the 2015 grants are awarded a new activity type will be added to identify activities for that grant.

Screen 2 – 9902 for an agency with 2 grants

This scenario shows an agency that had a 2014 Comprehensive Grant for which the funding period ended on 3/31/2015. The agency then received a 2015 Comprehensive Grant that started on 10/01/2014. The agency will need to submit the HUD Funded Activities for both grants. Each grant will have its own Activity Type.

5. CMS Readiness: CMS were asked to provide feedback on their readiness, and whether or not they feel they will be able to make the 10/01/2014 deadline for capturing data from the counselors and the 1st quarter 2015 (01/01/2015) deadline for reporting using the new version of ARM.
 - HCO responded that they did not feel CMS would tell us that they would not be ready. They asked to delve further into the discussion items from the last call related to Household vs individual clients. Theresa suggested that we schedule a call with HCO and HUD to go over their questions. Theresa will try to schedule that next week.
6. Activity Type Questions: Many questions came up regarding the use of Activity types. Many of those were business questions. Theresa will schedule a CMS call with HUD representatives to review those questions.

Q: How do you report HUD funded activities if 1 activity has multiple funding sources and is partially HUD Funded?

A: To be discussed further with HUD.

Q: How do agencies retroactively report HUD funded activities for awards they receive mid-year. If they resubmit will the 9902 be marked as late?

A: To be discussed further with HUD.

Q: Will HCS be checking client submissions with the 9902 submissions.

A: Not at this time, but will be planned for the future.

Q: If an agency updates a client record from a previous quarter, should it be resubmitted.

A: Yes.

Q: Follow-up question: In the 4th quarter I should then submit client records for the whole year?

A: For the fourth quarter you should submit new client records for the 4th quarter and any records from earlier in the fiscal year that have been updated.

Q: Will there be a follow-up CMS call to review the business process questions?

A: Yes
