
DRGR Fact Sheet: National Objectives for Disaster Recovery CDBG

Determining the National Objective and Benefit Type

In DRGR, national objectives and they type of information needed to document compliance with 24 CFR 570.208 depend in part on what type of activities are being undertaken. Many activities may use the national objective <u>Urgent Need</u> related to disaster recovery, but it is important to remember that at least 50% of spending for non-administrative activities under Disaster Recovery CDBG must be for activities classified as benefiting <u>Low to Moderate Income</u> households. HUD will examine an <u>overall benefit test</u>, but it will also examine individual activities to ensure their national objective is correctly classified and has required support in data shown in DRGR. In DRGR, grantees must enter information in enough detail for HUD staff to review the compliance for activities. In order to examine this information in DRGR, this means that program classified under the Low Mod national objective will often require more detail than programs classified under Urgent Need.



Under the Low Mod national objective, <u>many infrastructure and public facilities</u> qualify based on their service areas. In DRGR, this is called <u>area benefit</u>. Grantees use screens for Census and Survey methods in the DRGR Action Plan screens to identify these areas and document that the % low to moderate income population served is at least 51%. Under the Low Mod national objective, many <u>housing</u> activities are based on the incomes of the households assisted and many <u>economic development</u> activities are based on the income of the job holders for businesses assisted. In DRGR, this is called <u>direct benefit</u>. Grantees will include projections for these in their DRGR Action Plans and enter actual accomplishments in their Quarterly Performance Reports (QPRs).



Public Facilities & Infrastructure under Low Mod National Objective	Grantees must list activities separately for each organization awarded funds administering these activities and if they are different types of activities. They must also list each activityseparately based on service area if they are using census data .
Multifamily Housing Under Low Mod National Objective	Grantees must list activities separately for each <i>responsible organization</i> awarded funds administering these activities. They must either enter each <i>multifamily complex</i> assisted as a separate activity or <i>upload a file</i> that has information for each multifamily complex assisted with the organization developing/managing the complex with cumulative totals of households with income and race/ethnicity information for each complex.
Economic Development Under Low Mod Need National Objective	Grantees must list activities separately for each <i>responsible organization</i> awarded funds administering these activities. For Low Mod <u>Jobs</u> , they must either enter each <i>business</i> as a separate activity or <i>upload a file</i> that has information for each business assisted with cumulative totals of jobs created or retained with income and race/ethnicity information for each business. For Low Mod <u>Area</u> <u>Benefit</u> , they must enter each <i>business</i> as a separate activity based on the residential area served by the business using the Census or Survey data methods.



Low Mod - Area Benefit Data

Grantees must show the service area for Low Mod area benefit activities such as public facilities and infrastructure using either CENSUS or SURVEY METHODS screens. If the select Census, they have a number of options to ID geography at the county/city level or down to the Census Tract and Block Group. They can even copy service areas from other activities.



View Details

Once the geography is selected, they calculate the percent Low to Moderate based on the area. Grantees and HUD can view the details of Low to Mod population support data using the link ACTIVITY LMA DETAILS.

If Census Low Mod data is not accurate because it is too old or the geography does not match the service area well, grantees have the option of entering Low Mod and Total population using the SURVEY METHOD. If they do this, they can still ID the census geography if they would like and just not use the Low Mod data.
