OVERVIEW

The Emergency Housing Voucher (EHV) program provides administrative fee funding to Public Housing Agencies (PHAs) for expenses that are not normally eligible under the Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) program, as well as fees designated for the cost of administering the EHV program generally. PHAs receive the following fees as part of their EHV allocation: Preliminary Fee, Issuance Fee, Placement Fee, Ongoing Administrative Fee, and Service Fees. The chart below summarizes the amounts HUD provides for each of these fees.

Issuing Action Fee	PHAs will receive \$100 for each EHV that is initially leased if the PHA reported the vouch- er issuance in IMS/PIC (or PIC-NG when the system becomes available) within 14 days of the voucher issuance date or within 14 days of the issuance of this notice, whichever comes later. For example, voucher issued to family on 10-15- 21 and reported into PIC by the PHA on 10-17-21 will receive a \$100 issuance fee.	Any eligible admini- strative expenses related to the EHVs
Placement Fees	 \$500 for each EHV family placed under a HAP contract within 4 months of effective date of the ACC funding (beginning on 7/1/2021). \$250 for each EHV family placed under a HAP within 6 months after the effective date of the ACC funding (beginning on 7/1/2021). 	Any eligible admini- strative expenses related to the EHVs
