HOME-ARP: Needs Assessment and Gaps Analysis



The Needs Assessment and Gaps Analysis will serve as the basis for the PJ's strategy to distribute HOME-ARP funds. It is the PJ's analysis of the Qualifying Populations (QPs) within the jurisdiction as well as their housing, shelter, and service needs. It will inform the PJ's priority needs, support preferences or limitations, and establish methods of prioritization.

Understand the QPs

- Collect and use data to describe and analyze QPs
- Evaluate the size and demographic composition of each QP



Analyze QP Resources

- Identify and consider current resources available to QPs
- Identify the QPs unmet housing, shelter, and services needs
- Determine gaps in shelter and housing inventory and the service delivery system
- Establish the PJ's priority needs for the QPs

Include Narratives in Plans

Plans may include data, but **must include narratives** of the PJ's analysis for the following:

- Size and demographic composition of each of the QPs
- Housing, shelter, and service resources and needs for QPs
- Level of gaps in housing, shelter, and service delivery systems



Use Data and Analysis

Plans **must** describe how the data and analysis in this section justifies the following:

- · Priority needs
- Funded eligible activities
- Preferences, limitations, and prioritizations (if applicable)

If PJs plan to apply different characteristics of housing instability for QP4, they must do so in this section.

SUGGESTED DATA RESOURCES

Data may not be available to describe or quantify all four QPs. Requesting program data and information from consultation partners may help fill these gaps. PJs may extrapolate or estimate based on available data and should document their process as well as shortfalls or gaps in the data.

QP1: Homeless

Data collected by the CoC(s):

- Point in Time Count data
- Housing Inventory Count data
- HMIS (Homeless Management Information System) data

Plans should acknowledge if the PJ and CoC(s) geographies do not align exactly, estimate as necessary, and explain efforts to collect accurate information. For a list of CoCs serving the PJs, refer to the CoC HOME-ARP/CDBG/ESG Recipient Crosswalk.

QP3: Fleeing, or Attempting to Flee,

Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault, Stalking, or Human Trafficking

- <u>Domestic Violence Counts (Annual Census)</u> data
- Migration Data Portal (Human Trafficking) data
- National Sexual Violence Resource Center data
- Data from local shelters and victim services agencies
 - Parallel Coordinated Entry system data and reports
 - Call/email volume and turn-away numbers
 - Nights at or over shelter capacity

Unlike the CoC regulations, QP 3 eligibility does <u>no</u>t require a lack of housing and resources/support networks.

QP2: At Risk of Homelessness

- Data collected by homelessness prevention and emergency rental assistance programs
- Eviction data (<u>The Eviction Lab</u> and <u>Eviction Innovation</u>)
- Historical Census of Housing Tables: Crowding
- Data on persons exiting institutions or systems of care
- Local statistics from the following:

Suggestions for All QPs

- American Community Survey (ACS)
- Comprehensive Housing Affordability Strategy (CHAS)
- American Housing Survey (AHS)
- Joint Center for Housing Studies
- Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing (AFFH) planning tool
- CPD Maps Tool
- Recent Consolidated Plan
- Local reports such as housing needs assessments and housing strategies

- Community Action Agencies
- LEAP (Low-income Energy Assistance Program) providers
- Social Services Department (youth aging out of foster care)

QP4: Other populations

- Public Housing Authority (PHA) waitlist and wait time data
- Short and long-term rental assistance data
- Data collected by homelessness prevention and emergency rental assistance programs
- CoC data for formerly homeless households specifically those currently in temporary, emergency housing
- Data from emergency or temporary housing providers such as those exiting institutions and aging out of foster care
