NCHEC offers five certifications for homeownership practitioners and each meets the requirements of the National Industry Standards for Homeownership Education and Counseling.

#### Pre-Purchase Homeownership Education

This certification is recommended for educators who deliver a comprehensive homebuyer education training in a group seminar or workshop format.

 Certification is achieved by completing course H0229
 Homebuyer Education
 Methods: Training the Trainer and scoring a minimum of 80% on the accompanying exam.

#### Post-Purchase Homeownership Education

This certification is recommended for counselors who facilitate post-purchase seminars and workshops.

 Certification is achieved by completing the five-day course
 H0247 Post-Purchase
 Education Methods and scoring a minimum of 80% on the accompanying exam.



### Homeownership Counseling

This is a certification in one-on-one housing counseling. There are two training course requirements for this certification.

- Part I requires at least one year of one-on-one counseling experience, completion of the five-day course H0250 Homeownership Counseling Principles, Practices and Techniques, Part I and a minimum score of 80% on the accompanying exam.
- Part II entails completing the two-day course H0109 or H0109eI (e-learning)
   Beginning to Intermediate Foreclosure Prevention and scoring a minimum of 80% on the accompanying exam.

## Foreclosure Intervention and Default Counseling

This is an advanced level certification designed for professionals with at least one year of specific foreclosure intervention counseling experience. There are two training course requirements for this certification.

- Part I requires passing the online prerequisite exam before enrolling in the course HO345 Foreclosure Intervention and Default Counseling Certification, Part I. After taking the course, a score of 80% or higher is required on the accompanying exam.
- Part II requires completion of course H0307 Advanced Foreclosure: Case Study Practicum or H0320 Developing and implementing an Effective Foreclosure Program.



Recommended for professionals at the management level, this certification attests to one's ability to effectively manage the day-to-day operations of a housing counseling program.

#### **Steps to Obtain**

## **Certification Renewal**

NCHEC certification is valid for three years from date of issuance and can be renewed before it expires. If your certification is expired or expiring, in order to maintain a valid NCHEC certification, practitioners must:



Complete within three years from date of issuance a minimum of 30 hours (10 hours per year) of continuing education on homeownership topics such as pre- or post-purchase homeownership education, counseling, foreclosure prevention, real estate or mortgage lending.

Submit a signed National Industry Standards of Homeownership Education and Counseling **Code of Ethics and Conduct form**, which can be obtained from www.homeownershipstandards.com.
