

Are you are a public housing applicant or resident with a disability?

You have the right to request and receive necessary **REASONABLE ACCOMMODATIONS** or Modifications, free of cost.



A REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION is a change in rule, policy, practice, or service, or a structural change, that lets a person with a disability have an equal opportunity to use and enjoy their housing, including common areas, and participate in programs.

Reasonable accommodations are available during the admissions process and throughout tenancy including during reexaminations, lease enforcement, and grievances.

Assistance animals: Reasonable accommodations to pet policies for individuals who use an assistance animal that performs work, tasks, emotional support, or other services that alleviate identified symptoms or effects of the individual's disability must be permitted.
