Section 4 Program Overview

The Section 4 Capacity Building Grant Program was authorized by Section 4 of the HUD Demonstration Act of 1993. The Section 4 program was designed to enhance the capacity and ability of community development corporations (CDCs) and community housing development organizations (CHDOs) to carry out affordable housing and community development activities that benefit low- and moderate-income families. The program has a nationwide focus and grantees work to build the capacity of eligible organizations through activities like training and education, technical assistance, and financial assistance. The four year grant term for the FY2013 awards run from September 2013 to September 2017.

FY2013 Grant Award Program Outputs

In FY2013, \$35,000,000 was awarded competitively through a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) selection process to three national non-profits: Enterprise Community Partners (Enterprise), Habitat for Humanity International (HFHI), and Local Initiatives Support Corporation (LISC). As of December 2016, the three grantees have achieved the following accomplishments:

Section 4 Program Service Area and Type

As of December 2016, the Section 4 grantees provided capacity building support to 703 total organizations located in 45 States plus the District of Columbia.
