Section 4 Program Overview

The Section 4 Capacity Building Grant Program was authorized by Section 4 of the HUD Demonstration Act of 1993. The Section 4 program was designed to enhance the capacity and ability of community development corporations (CDCs) and community housing development organizations (CHDOs) to carry out affordable housing and community development activities that benefit low- and moderate-income families. The program has a nationwide focus and grantees work to build the capacity of eligible organizations through activities like training and education, technical assistance, and financial assistance. The four year grant term for the FY2014 awards run from October 2014 to October 2018.

FY2013 Grant Award Program Outputs

In FY2014, \$35,000,000 was awarded competitively through a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) selection process to three national non-profits: Enterprise Community Partners (Enterprise), Habitat for Humanity International (HFHI), and Local Initiatives Support Corporation (LISC). As of December 2016, the three grantees have achieved the following accomplishments:

Section 4 Program Service Area and Type

As of December 2016, the Section 4 grantees provided capacity building support to 829 total organizations located in 46 States plus DC and Puerto Rico. In general, these organizations have been served with one of three primary techniques: financial assistance, technical assistance, or training and education (see below).
