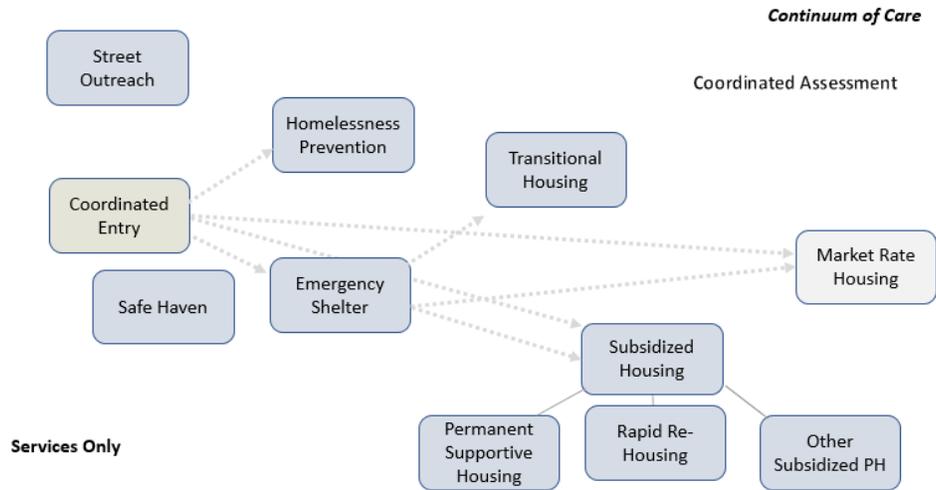
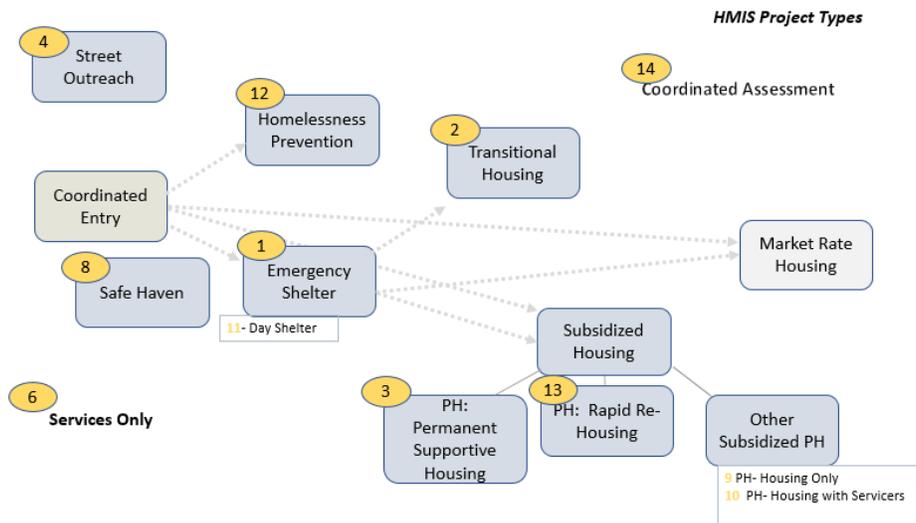


A quick review of what to check in your HMIS to be sure you are generating **SYSTEM PERFORMANCE MEASURES** as accurately as possible.

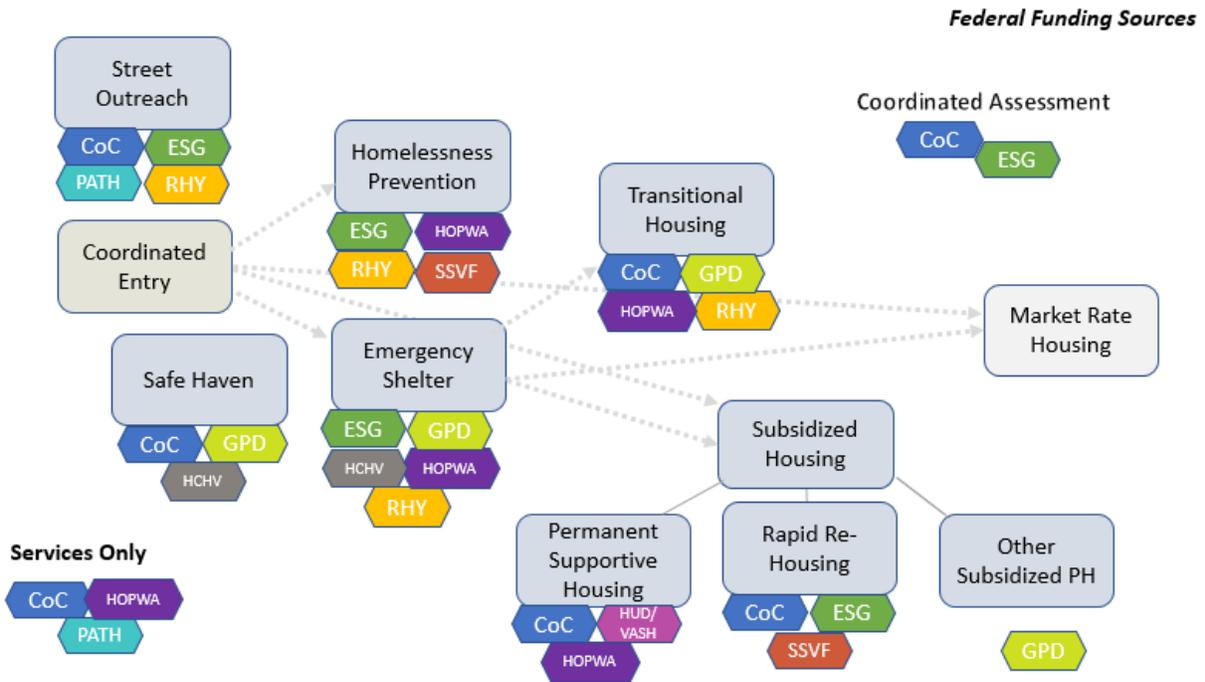
First – all of the projects that are part of your Continuum of Care (CoC) should be in your HMIS. When all homeless housing and services are part of your HMIS, the system would look something like the chart below. (A “Coordinated Entry” point and the placement of a “Coordinated Assessment” may have a variety of different touch points in your system depending on how they are structured in your CoC.)



Second – all of the projects that are part of your CoC should be identified with the correct **Project Type** (HMIS Element 2.4) in your HMIS. Project types are set by the HMIS System Administrator and are critical to performance measures being able to access client’s records from only those programs required in each measure. The project type numbers for your system are those numbers shown in the chart below.



Third – all of the projects associated with all of the HMIS Federal Partners should be included in your HMIS and should be identified in the Federal Partner Funding Sources (HMIS element 2.6) correctly in your system. It is especially important for System Performance Measure 4 on Employment and Income as these measures will count all of the CoC funded projects, and only those projects.



Fourth – the following elements are the ones used to generate the System Performance Measures. When looking at data quality these are the only ones you need to focus on.

Fifth – different project types are used to generate different System Performance Measures. As you review the output from your HMIS about the measures it's important to understand what projects are being reported on so you have some context to determine if the measures are calculating correctly.
